

Library and Information Week

This year Rockhampton celebrates 70 years since Council took over control of the School of Arts and established the Rockhampton Municipal Library Service in 1947. The Library building, on the corner of William and Alma Streets – now the home of the Rockhampton History Centre – was opened 40 years ago in 1977. Library and Information Week is held 22-28 May 2017.

Homeless Connect

Homelessness in Australia is a significant social issue, and often the result of a multitude of factors. Domestic or family violence and a lack of affordable housing are some of the contributing elements. Other contributors are poor mental health, family breakdown, poverty, lease expiry, violence and abuse, chronic gambling, substance abuse, leaving state care or leaving prison. People who are struggling to find suitable or affordable accommodation are invited to attend the Homeless Connect event held at the Rockhampton Showgrounds each year, where government agencies, community organisations and support groups offer one-point access to essential services and support for the vulnerable in the community.

Support this initiative by donating non-perishable goods, clean quality clothes, children's books or personal hygiene products. Items can be dropped off at any library branch or the School of Arts in Bolsover Street before Monday 22 May.





Did you know?

The word 'robotics' was coined by a writer.

Russian-born American sci-fi writer Isaac Asimov first used the word in 1942 in his short story 'Runabout'. Asimov characterised the robots in his short stories as helpful servants of man and viewed robots as 'a better, cleaner race.' Asimov also proposed three "Laws of Robotics" that his robots, as well as sci-fi robotic characters of many other stories, followed:

Law 1: A robot may not injure a human being or, through inaction, allow a human being to come to harm.

Law 2: A robot must obey the orders given to it by human beings except where such orders would conflict with the First Law.

Law 3: A robot must protect its own existence as long as such protection does not conflict with the First or Second Law.

Free History Jalk

CANTON - CAPRICORNIA - CANBERRA: The girl with the alien ancestor who once joined the Red Army.

In this talk, combining Chinese history in Central Queensland with a present day look at a family heritage, Marilyn Sue Dooley will explore the customs and traditions that many nineteenth century Chinese brought with them from their Cantonese homeland, the attitudes and events that they encountered when gold, in particular, brought them to the Capricorn region; and the adventures descendants can have with travels in search of a cultural heritage.
