## Executive Summary

### Introduction

Rockhampton Regional Council commissioned GHD Pty Ltd in association with Economic Associates Pty Ltd in September 2010 to prepare an Economic Development and Employment Study. The purpose of the Economic Development & Employment Study is to:

- ▶ Analyse key characteristics of the Rockhampton Region's economy and outline the likely future economic growth directions;
- ▶ Assess the effectiveness of current planning scheme provisions in facilitating the economic growth of the region;
- ▶ Analyse employment growth and project the region's employment to 2031; and
- ▶ Estimate future land requirements across the region for key land use categories.

This executive summary provides an overview of key assumptions, analysis and findings. Detailed analysis can be found in the body of the report.

### Comparative Economic Overview

Rockhampton Regional Council and its planning areas are benchmarked against a number of other regions, namely:

- ▶ Gladstone Regional Council;
- ▶ Mackay Regional Council;
- ▶ Townsville City Council; and
- ▶ Central Highlands Regional Council.

Key findings from the comparison of socio-economic profiles of the above regional council areas included:

- ▶ Historical population growth within the Rockhampton region was less than the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The average age within the Rockhampton region was higher than the state average and that of the competitor regions;
- ▶ Average household size was broadly consistent with the state average and all competitor regions, except Central Highlands;
- ▶ Household income within the Rockhampton region was below the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The Rockhampton region has traditionally experienced lower levels of labour force participation and higher levels of unemployment than the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The incidence of post school qualification within the Rockhampton region was below the state average, but generally above that in competitor regions; and
- ▶ Projected population growth for the Rockhampton region is below projected growth rates for Queensland and competitor regions.



Rockhampton Regional Council shares the same dominant industries in terms of number of business as the other analysed regional councils, these being:

- ▶ Agriculture, forestry and fishing;
- ▶ Construction;
- ▶ Retail trade;
- ▶ Transport and storage; and
- ▶ Property and business services.

Rockhampton Regional Council had a significantly lower proportion of agriculture, forestry and fishing businesses (16.4%) than Central Highlands Regional Council (39.6%). A lower proportion of construction and agriculture, forestry and fishing businesses was recorded in Rockhampton Regional Council compared to Townsville City Council.

Sole traders were less prevalent in Rockhampton Regional Council (54.6%) than in Townsville City Council (60.9%) and Central Highlands Regional Council (58.8%). Marginally more businesses employing one to 20 employees were recorded in Rockhampton Regional Council (41.2%) than the other analysed regional councils.

### **Regional Supply Chain**

From each of the key industry sectors identified in Rockhampton Regional Council, the three most significant supply chain and customer sectors were identified based on the detailed supply chain and customer market analysis of the key regionally competitive industry sectors (refer to Table 4.3 in section 4) contained in **Appendix B**. The analysis then identified the most common supply chain and customer sectors for all key industry sectors within Rockhampton Regional Council.

Overall, the most significant key sectors supplying enterprises within Rockhampton Regional Council are:

- ▶ Legal, accounting, marketing and business management services;
- ▶ Other property services;
- ▶ Wholesale trade;
- ▶ Medicinal and pharmaceutical products, pesticides manufacturing;
- ▶ Services to agriculture, hunting and trapping;
- ▶ Construction trade services;
- ▶ Other food products manufacturing;
- ▶ Communication services; and
- ▶ Other business services.

The most significant sectors being supplied by enterprises within Rockhampton Regional Council are:

- ▶ Retail trade;
- ▶ Accommodation, cafes and restaurants;
- ▶ Wholesale trade;
- ▶ Meat and meat products manufacturing;





- ▶ Electricity supply;
- ▶ Other business services;
- ▶ Road transport;
- ▶ Scientific research, technical and computer services;
- ▶ Legal, accounting, marketing and business management services; and
- ▶ Education.

### **Rockhampton Region Planning Sub Areas**

A total of 21 sub areas were defined within Rockhampton Regional Council based on existing and planned activity within Rockhampton Regional Council and its component planning areas. The sub areas were defined based on Census collection district boundaries, the smallest geographic area defined in the Australian Standard Geographical Classification. The definition of these sub areas were agreed to by Rockhampton Regional Council.

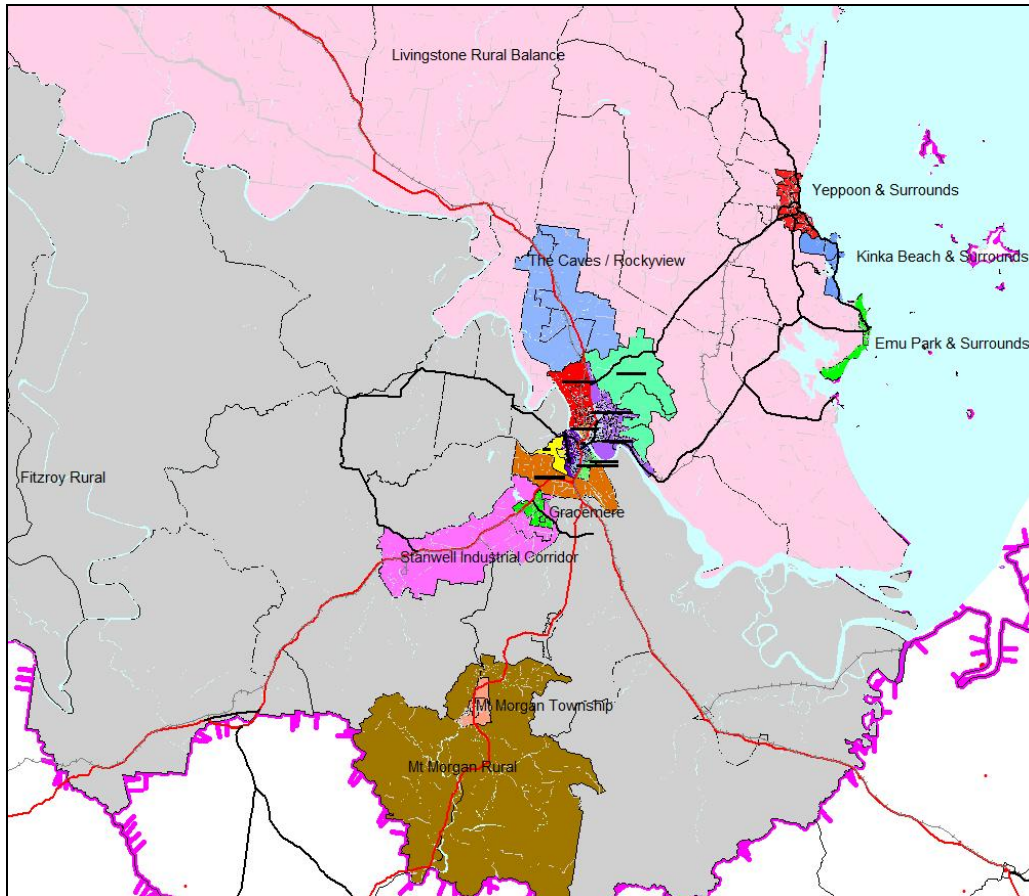
The sub areas within each planning area are as follows:

  - Gracemere;
  - Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
  - Fitzroy Rural;
- ▶ Livingstone planning area:
  - Emu Park and Surrounds;
  - Kinka Beach and Surrounds;
  - Livingstone Rural Balance;
  - The Caves/Rockyview; and
  - Yeppoon and Surrounds;
- ▶ Mount Morgan planning area:
  - Mount Morgan Township; and
  - Mount Morgan Rural;
- ▶ Rockhampton planning area:
  - Airport;
  - CBD;
  - North Rockhampton Balance;
  - North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
  - North Rockhampton Industrial;
  - North Rockhampton Residential;
  - Parkhurst- Kawana Industrial Corridor;
  - South Rockhampton Industrial;
  - South Rockhampton Balance;
  - South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and

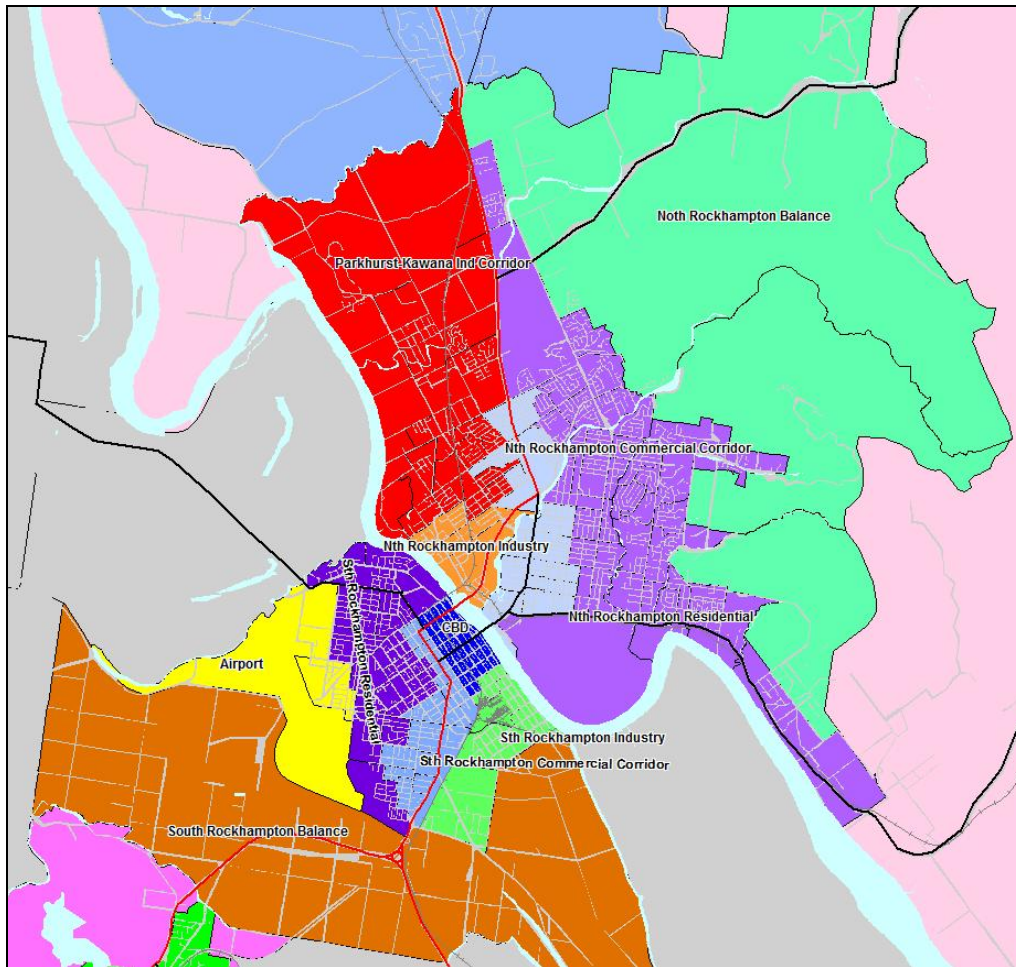
- South Rockhampton Residential.

### Employment and Land Use Projections

For each sub area, the net land required to accommodate the following uses has also been identified:

- ▶ Industrial;
- ▶ Commercial office;
- ▶ Retail;
- ▶ Education;
- ▶ Health;
- ▶ Public order & safety; and
- ▶ Other (hospitality, sport & recreation & similar).

Employment estimates at the two digit ANZSIC level are provided in **Appendix D** for each sub area.

Employment and net land demand projections in this report are based on a number of factors, including:

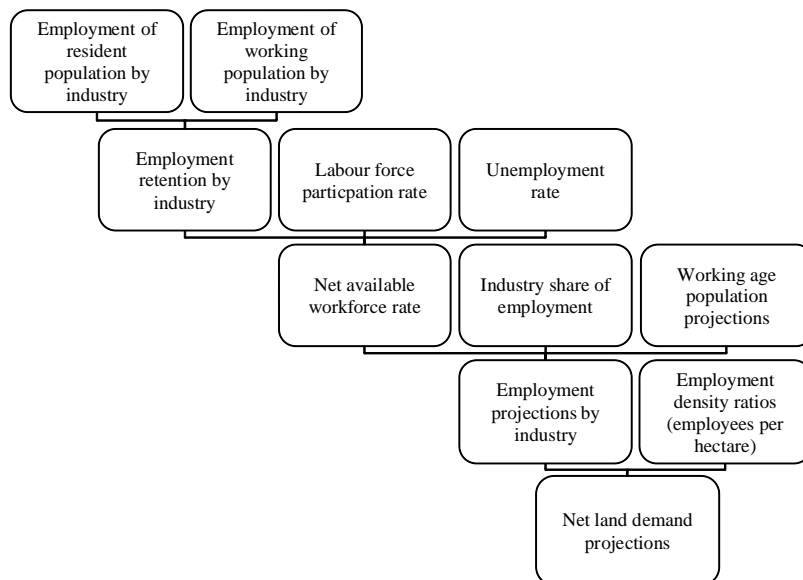
- ▶ The net available workforce rate, which is derived using:

- Employment retention (or jobs balance) rates by industry sector (resident population employment by industry divided by working population by industry);
- Labour force participation and unemployment rates;
- ▶ Industry share of employment for relevant sectors; and
- ▶ Working age (persons aged 15 to 64 years) population projections.

Net land demand (or allotment demand) is derived by applying employment density ratios (employees per hectare) for each industry sector to the employment projections.

**Figure E-3** below is a flowchart of the process of calculating employment and net land demand projections. Details of assumptions are provided in section 6 of this report.

Detailed employment projections and supported assumption are provided in section 6 and Appendices C and D of this report. For statistical reasons, projections are reported based on planning areas boundaries.

**Fitzroy Planning Area**

By 2031, employment within the Fitzroy planning area is projected to be:

- ▶ 2,044 persons in Gracemere;
- ▶ 1,736 persons in Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
- ▶ 729 persons in Fitzroy Rural.



Within Gracemere, employment is projected to be highest in the other (779 persons by 2031), commercial office (306 persons by 2031) and industrial (300 persons by 2031) sectors.

Within the Stanwell Industrial Corridor, the majority of employment is anticipated to be in the industrial sector increasing from 469 persons in 2010 to 1,453 persons in 2031. Within Fitzroy Rural, employment is projected to be highest in the other sector increasing from 293 persons in 2010 to 525 persons in 2031.

### Livingstone Planning Area

By 2031, employment within the Livingstone planning area is projected to be:



- ▶ 877 persons in Emu Park & Surrounds;
- ▶ 312 persons in Kinka Beach & Surrounds;
- ▶ 2,389 persons in Livingstone Rural Balance;
- ▶ 564 persons in The Caves / Rockyview; and
- ▶ 7,263 persons in Yeppoon & Surrounds.

Within Emu Park & Surrounds, employment is projected to be highest in the other (401 persons by 2031) and health (182 persons by 2031) sectors. Within Kinka Beach & Surrounds and Livingstone Rural Balance, the majority of employment is anticipated to be within other (148 and 1,000 persons by 2031 respectively) and industrial (144 and 968 persons by 2031 respectively). Employment within The Caves / Rockyview sub area is projected to be highest in public order and safety (278 persons by 2031) and other (196 persons by 2031).

Within the Livingstone planning area, Yeppoon & Surrounds is the most significant sub area in terms of employment. By 2031, employment is projected to be highest in the commercial office (1,665 persons), other (1,536 persons) and industrial (1,326 persons) sectors.

### Mount Morgan Planning Area

Within the Mount Morgan planning area, employment within the sub areas in 2031 is projected to be:

- ▶ 534 persons in Mount Morgan Township; and
- ▶ 44 persons in Mount Morgan Rural.

Within Mount Morgan Township, employment is projected to be highest in the health (141 persons by 2031) and education (102 persons by 2031) sectors. In Mount Morgan Rural, the majority of employment is anticipated to be split between industrial (20 persons by 2031) and other (14 persons by 2031).

**Rockhampton Planning Area**

By 2031, employment in the sub areas of Rockhampton planning area is projected to be:

- ▶ 615 persons in the Airport;
- ▶ 8,516 persons in the CBD;
- ▶ 106 persons in Rockhampton Balance;
- ▶ 4,648 persons in the North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
- ▶ 1,906 persons in North Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 4,584 persons in North Rockhampton Residential;
- ▶ 6,564 persons in the Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor;
- ▶ 2,041 persons in South Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 201 persons in South Rockhampton Balance;
- ▶ 3,844 persons in the South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and
- ▶ 5,148 persons in South Rockhampton Residential.





The majority of employment in the Airport sub area is split between public order and safety (322 persons by 2031) and industrial (197 persons by 2031). In the CBD, employment is anticipated to be highest in the commercial office (4,032 persons by 2031), other (1,875 persons by 2031) and retail (1,284 persons by 2031) sectors.

The majority of employment in the North Rockhampton Balance sub area is projected to be in other (103 persons by 2031). Employment in the North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor is anticipated to be highest in the retail (1,961 persons by 2031), commercial office (644 persons by 2031) and other (641 persons by 2031) sectors.

The industrial sector is anticipated to account for a significant proportion of employment (over 45%) in the North Rockhampton Industrial (889 persons by 2031), Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor (4,662 persons by 2031), South Rockhampton Industrial (1,492 persons by 2031) and South Rockhampton Balance (169 persons by 2031) sub areas.

In the North Rockhampton Residential sub area employment is projected to be highest in the education (1,525 persons by 2031) and other (1,091 persons by 2031) sectors. In the South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor, employment is anticipated to be highest in the other (958 persons by 2031) and health (805 persons by 2031) sectors. In the South Rockhampton Residential sub area employment is anticipated to be highest in the health (2,542 persons by 2031) and education (1,160 persons by 2031) sectors.

### Projected Net Land Demand

Employment estimates have been converted into net land demand estimates, using the following employment densities:

- ▶ Industrial – 25 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Commercial office – 250 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Retail – 170 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Education – 100 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Health – 100 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Other – 100 employees per hectare; and
- ▶ Public order & safety – 100 employees per hectare.

These employment densities have been derived through consultation with key stakeholders in Rockhampton Regional Council and from previous consultancies in Central Queensland.

### Fitzroy Planning Area

By 2031, within Fitzroy Planning Area there is projected to be net incremental land demand of 53.1 hectares, comprising:

- ▶ 8.6 hectares in Gracemere;
- ▶ 39.8 hectares in Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
- ▶ 4.7 hectares in Fitzroy Rural.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand within all sub areas, accounting for 82.3% of net incremental demand in 2031.

### Livingstone Planning Area

By 2031, within Livingstone Planning Area there is projected to be net incremental land demand of 56.9 hectares, comprising:

- ▶ 2.4 hectares in Emu Park & Surrounds;
- ▶ 1.8 hectares in Kinka Beach & Surrounds;
- ▶ 18.0 hectares in Livingstone Rural Balance;



- ▶ 1.9 hectares in The Caves / Rockyview; and
- ▶ 32.9 hectares in Yeppoon & Surrounds.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand, accounting for 59.3% of net incremental demand in Livingstone Planning Area in 2031.

### Mount Morgan Planning Area

By 2031, within Mount Morgan Planning Area there is projected to be net incremental land demand of 1.8 hectares, comprising:

- ▶ 1.6 hectares in Mount Morgan Township; and
- ▶ 0.2 hectares in Mount Morgan Rural.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand, accounting for 45.2% of net incremental demand in Mount Morgan Planning Area in 2031.

- ▶ 1.0 hectares in Airport;
- ▶ 6.6 hectares in CBD;
- ▶ 0.1 hectares in North Rockhampton Balance;
- ▶ 5.0 hectares in North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
- ▶ 3.6 hectares in North Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 5.1 hectares in North Rockhampton Residential;
- ▶ 41.5 hectares in Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor;
- ▶ 7.3 hectares in South Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 0.6 hectares in South Rockhampton Balance;





- ▶ 4.9 hectares in South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and
- ▶ 6.4 hectares in South Rockhampton Residential.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand, accounting for 66.5% of net incremental demand in Mount Morgan Planning Area in 2031.

# 1. Introduction

## 1.1 Purpose of Study

Rockhampton Regional Council commissioned GHD Pty Ltd in association with Economic Associates Pty Ltd in September 2010 to prepare an Economic Development and Employment Study. The purpose of the Economic Development & Employment Study is to:

- ▶ Analyse key characteristics of the Rockhampton Region's economy and outline the likely future economic growth directions;
- ▶ Assess the effectiveness of current planning scheme provisions in facilitating the economic growth of the region;
- ▶ Analyse employment growth and project the region's employment to 2031; and
- ▶ Estimate future land requirements across the region for key land use categories.

This analysis of the Rockhampton region will assist in understanding how it compares with other key regions across the state, the strengths and the likely future direction of the region's economic growth and how best the planning scheme can maximise its contribution to the economic growth of the region.

It is intended that the employment growth projections across the region will in turn underpin the estimates of land requirements for various parts of the region across all key land use categories. This information will provide the basis for planning sustainable growth of the region's activity centres and industrial areas.

## 1.2 Report Structure

This report is structured as follows:

- ▶ Section 1: Introduction: This section outlines the purpose of the study and report structure;
- ▶ Section 2: Comparative Regional Economic Overview: This section provides an overview of the socio-economic environment, anticipated future population, labour market conditions and enterprise activity within Rockhampton Regional Council, benchmarked against Gladstone Regional Council, Mackay Regional Council, Townsville City Council and Central Highlands Regional Council. It will also discuss regulatory constraints which have likely inhibited economic development within the former Council areas;
- ▶ Section 3: Rockhampton Regional Overview: This section provides an overview of the major projects within Rockhampton Regional Council and major coal activity within Central West SD (Rockhampton is the major service centre). A summary of agricultural production within Rockhampton Regional Council is also presented;
- ▶ Section 4: Industrial Futures Diagnostics: This section provides an analysis of the region's competitive advantages and identifies potential gaps within the region's supply chains and customer markets that could be developed;
- ▶ Section 5: Sub Area Analysis: This section defines the sub areas within Rockhampton Regional Council and provides a socio-economic overview of the identified sub areas; and



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- ▶ Section 6: Employment and Land Use Projections: This section provides an overview of employment and land use projections for each of the identified sub areas.



## 2. Comparative Regional Economic Overview

The purpose of this section of the report is to provide an overview of Rockhampton Regional Council and its planning areas, namely:

- ▶ Fitzroy Planning Area (former Fitzroy local government area);
- ▶ Livingstone Planning Area (former Livingstone local government area);
- ▶ Mount Morgan Planning Area (former Mont Morgan local government area); and
- ▶ Rockhampton Planning Area (former Rockhampton local government area).

Rockhampton Regional Council and its planning areas have been benchmarked against a number of other regions, namely:

- ▶ Gladstone Regional Council;
- ▶ Mackay Regional Council;
- ▶ Townsville City Council; and
- ▶ Central Highlands Regional Council.

This analysis has been undertaken to assess the relative competitive and comparative advantages of Rockhampton Regional Council, and to provide an understanding of the region's key strengths, opportunities, weaknesses and threats.

### 2.1 Socio-Economic Overview

A socio-economic profile of the Fitzroy, Livingstone, Mount Morgan and Rockhampton planning areas as at the 1996, 2001 and 2006 Censuses of Population and Housing, benchmarked against Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland is provided in **Table 2-1**. Rockhampton Regional Council is then compared with Gladstone Regional Council, Mackay Regional Council, Townsville City Council<sup>1</sup> and Central Highlands Regional Council. A number of key points can be drawn from this profile, these points being:

- ▶ In 2006, there were 102,130 persons living in Rockhampton Regional Council, accounting for approximately 52.4% of the Fitzroy SD population, including:
  - 10,287 persons living in the Fitzroy planning area, or 10.1% of the Rockhampton Regional Council population;
  - 29,554 persons living in the Livingstone planning area, or 28.9% of the Rockhampton Regional Council population;
  - 2,912 persons living in the Mount Morgan planning area, or 2.9% of the Rockhampton Regional Council population; and
  - 59,377 persons living in the Rockhampton planning area, or 58.1% of the Rockhampton Regional Council population;

- ▶ Population growth in Rockhampton Regional Council was higher between 2001 and 2006 than between 1996 and 2001. The Livingstone planning was the only planning area within Rockhampton Regional Council to record an average annual population growth higher than Fitzroy SD. Rockhampton Regional Council recorded slower population growth than the other Regional Councils analysed;
- ▶ The Fitzroy planning area had a young family oriented population with a significantly lower average age of residents (35.6 years) than the other component planning areas of Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Almost 40% of households within the Fitzroy planning area are couple families with children households;
- ▶ The Livingstone planning area had a relatively mature population with a high proportion of persons aged 65 years and over compared with Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. The Livingstone planning area traditionally has a higher average age of residents than Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland;
- ▶ The Mount Morgan planning area had a mature population with a higher average age of residents (41.9 years) than Rockhampton Regional Council and its component planning areas, Fitzroy SD and Queensland;
- ▶ The Rockhampton planning area had a relatively high incidence of residents aged 15 to 24 years compared with Rockhampton Regional Council and its component planning areas, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. In 2006, the average age of residents in the Rockhampton planning area was above the Fitzroy SD average and similar to Queensland;
- ▶ The average age of residents in Rockhampton Regional Council was higher than the other regional councils analysed but was comparable to Queensland;
- ▶ The Livingstone planning area had a relatively high proportion of couple families without children households compared with the other planning areas within Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Between 2001 and 2006, Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a decline in the proportion of couple families with children households and an increase in the proportion of couple families without children and lone person households;
- ▶ Within Rockhampton Regional Council, there was a relatively high incidence of households fully owning their home, including over 35% in the Livingstone and Mount Morgan planning areas. The Fitzroy planning area recorded a significantly higher proportion of households with a mortgage than the other planning areas within Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a lower proportion of households paying off a mortgage than Gladstone, Mackay and Townsville Regional Councils;
- ▶ Between 1996 and 2006, the Mount Morgan planning area was the only region to record an increase in the proportion of households renting. Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a lower proportion of households renting than Townsville and Central Highlands Regional Councils;
- ▶ Households within Rockhampton Regional Council generally earn a lower income than the other Regional Councils analysed, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Within Rockhampton Regional Council, households in the Mount Morgan planning area recorded the lowest average weekly household income (\$648);
- ▶ The average monthly housing loan repayment was higher in the Livingstone planning area than in Rockhampton Regional Council and Fitzroy SD. Compared with the other Regional Councils





analysed, Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a lower average monthly housing loan repayment;

- ▶ The labour force participation rate in Rockhampton Regional Council was lower than in Gladstone, Mackay, Townsville and Central Highlands Regional Councils, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Between 1996 and 2006, the unemployment rate decreased in all regions but was higher in Rockhampton Regional Council than in Mackay, Townsville and Central Highlands Regional Councils, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. The unemployment rate in the Mount Morgan planning area was significantly higher than in the other regions (15.3% in 2006);
- ▶ The proportion of persons with a post-school qualification in Rockhampton Regional Council increased significantly between 1996 and 2006 but was lower than the rate in Central Highlands Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the Livingstone planning area recorded the highest incidence of persons with a post-school qualification;
- ▶ Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a relatively high proportion of persons employed in blue collar professions compared with Queensland but a lower than Gladstone, Mackay and Central Highlands Regional Councils. Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the incidence of persons employed in lower blue collar professions was over 30% in the Mount Morgan planning area. The composition of employment remained relatively stable in Rockhampton Regional Council between 1996 and 2006;
- ▶ In Rockhampton Regional Council, the most significant industries of employment in 2006 were retail trade, health care and social assistance, and education and training. Compared with Queensland, Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a lower proportion of persons employed in the professional, scientific and technical services and manufacturing industries; and
- ▶ Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the Fitzroy and Mount Morgan planning areas recorded a relatively high proportion of persons employed in industrial sectors with the Fitzroy planning area also recording a high proportion of persons employed in agriculture, forestry and fishing. The Livingstone planning area recorded a relatively high proportion of persons employed in the construction, accommodation and food services, and education and training industries.

### 2.1.1 Population Projections

The population in Rockhampton Regional Council is projected to increase from 118,383 persons in 2010 to 164,745 persons in 2031, or by approximately 1.6% per annum. The Livingstone planning area is anticipated to account for almost half of the population growth in Rockhampton Regional Council and is projected to increase from 35,156 persons in 2010 to 58,356 persons in 2031, or by approximately 2.4% per annum. The population in the Rockhampton planning area is estimated to account for 56.4% of the Rockhampton Regional Council population in 2010, decreasing to 49.5% in 2031.

Population growth and household formation is anticipated to be lower in Rockhampton Regional Council than in Gladstone, Mackay, Townsville and Central Highlands Regional Councils, Fitzroy SD and Queensland. In the Fitzroy and Livingstone planning areas, population growth and household formation is anticipated to be above Rockhampton Regional Council, Fitzroy SD and Queensland.

## 2.1.2 Socio-economic Overview-Summary

Key findings from the comparison of socio-economic profiles of the above regional council areas included:

- ▶ Historical population growth within the Rockhampton region was less than the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The average age within the Rockhampton region was higher than the state average and that of the competitor regions;
- ▶ Average household size was broadly consistent with the state average and all competitor regions, except Central Highlands;
- ▶ Household income within the Rockhampton region was below the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The Rockhampton region has traditionally experienced lower levels of labour force participation and higher levels of unemployment than the state average and competitor regions;
- ▶ The incidence of post school qualification within the Rockhampton region was below the state average, but generally above that in competitor regions; and
- ▶ Projected population growth for the Rockhampton region is below projected growth rates for Queensland and competitor regions.

## 2.2 Labour Market Overview

### 2.2.1 Labour Force Size

In 1996, there were an estimated 42,028 persons in the labour force in Rockhampton Regional Council, the majority of which were in the Rockhampton planning area (26,733 persons) and the Livingstone planning area (10,247 persons). In 2009, the labour force size in Rockhampton Regional Council increased to 58,276 persons, including:

- ▶ 6,266 persons in the Fitzroy planning area;
- ▶ 16,188 persons in the Livingstone planning area;
- ▶ 1,112 persons in the Mount Morgan planning area; and
- ▶ 34,711 persons in the Rockhampton planning area.

### 2.2.2 Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate in Rockhampton Regional Council decreased from 10.8% in 1996 to 3.9% in 2007, before increasing to 7.1% in 2009. In 2009, the unemployment rate in Rockhampton Regional Council was above the Queensland unemployment rate (5.4%). Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the unemployment rate was significantly higher in the Mount Morgan planning area (23.5% in 2009) than in the Fitzroy, Livingstone and Rockhampton planning areas (4.4%, 6.0% and 7.7% in 2009 respectively). All of the regions recorded an increase in the unemployment rate between 2007 and 2009 with the Mount Morgan planning area recording the largest increase (10.3 percentage points).

In 2009, Rockhampton Regional Council recorded a higher unemployment rate than the other regional councils analysed, Fitzroy SD and Queensland.

## 2.3 Enterprise Activity

### 2.3.1 Fitzroy Planning Area

In 2007, there were an estimated 864 registered businesses in the Fitzroy planning area including 345 agriculture, forestry and fishing businesses and 144 construction businesses. Over half of the total businesses in the Fitzroy planning area were non-employing businesses (sole traders) while 24.7% employed between one and four persons.

Industries that typically utilize industrial land include:

- ▶ Manufacturing;
- ▶ Wholesale trade; and
- ▶ Transport and storage.

Within industrial sectors there were 27 manufacturing businesses, nine wholesale trade businesses and 105 transport and storage businesses.

**Table 2-5** summarises the incidence of employment by industry by number of employees in the Fitzroy planning area.

### 2.3.2 Livingstone Planning Area

### 2.3.4 Rockhampton Planning Area

### 2.3.5 Rockhampton Regional Council

### 2.3.7 Summary: Enterprise Activity

Rockhampton Regional Council shares the same dominant industries in terms of number of business as the other analysed regional councils, these being:

- ▶ Agriculture, forestry and fishing;
- ▶ Construction;
- ▶ Retail trade;
- ▶ Transport and storage; and
- ▶ Property and business services.

Rockhampton Regional Council had a significantly lower proportion of agriculture, forestry and fishing businesses (16.4%) than Central Highlands Regional Council (39.6%). A lower proportion of construction and agriculture, forestry and fishing businesses was recorded in Rockhampton Regional Council compared to Townsville City Council.

Sole traders were less prevalent in Rockhampton Regional Council (54.6%) than in Townsville City Council (60.9%) and Central Highlands Regional Council (58.8%). Marginally more businesses

employing one to 20 employees were recorded in Rockhampton Regional Council (41.2%) than the other analysed regional councils.

## 3. Rockhampton Regional Overview

This section of the report provides an overview of the major projects completed, under construction, committed and under investigation within Rockhampton Regional Council or its hinterland. In addition, a summary of the major coal projects within the Central West Statistical Division is provided. While Rockhampton Regional Council is not located within the Central West Statistical Division, it is anticipated to represent the major service centre for coal projects within this region. An overview of agricultural production activity in Rockhampton Regional Council is also provided in this section of the report.

### 3.1 Major Projects

#### 3.1.1 Rockhampton Regional Council & Hinterland

There are approximately 18 major projects in Rockhampton Regional Council and its hinterland including \$256 million of completed projects, \$641 million of projects under construction, \$4,000 million of committed projects and \$2,116 million of projects under investigation. In Rockhampton Regional Council, energy, rail and water projects accounted for two thirds of projects. Major coal mine projects are outlined in the subsequent section of this report.

Significant projects within Rockhampton Regional Council and its hinterland include the Gladstone Pacific Nickel Refinery and the ZeroGen Clean Coal Power Station Project. The Gladstone Pacific Nickel Refinery will process ore from Gladstone Pacific Nickel Limited's two mine sites located at Marlborough and New Caledonia. Stage 1 will produce 60,000 tonnes of nickel and 6,000 tonnes of cobalt per year. During the first few years of operation, rail will transport ore from Marlborough to Gladstone but, later, a dedicated 175km ore slurry pipeline will transport the ore. The environmental impact assessment was approved by the Queensland State Government in January 2009 and the Federal Government of Australia in May 2009. The project has an estimated cost of \$4 billion.

The ZeroGen Clean Coal Power Station Project includes the construction and operation of a commercial power generation facility that would generate 530 megawatts (gross) of low-emission baseload electricity. ZeroGen will integrate the technologies of Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle (IGCC) with Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) to produce the low-emission baseload electricity. The project has a planned deployment date of late 2015 and will potentially capture and store up to 90% of CO<sub>2</sub> for full sequestration. Stage one of the project has an estimated cost of \$1.7 billion. ZeroGen's prefeasibility study was completed in July 2010.

There are also a number of rail projects within Rockhampton Regional Council and its hinterland that are currently completed or under construction, including:

- ▶ 12 and 16 Cylinder Loco Overhauls (under construction), estimated cost of \$80 million;
- ▶ Electric Loco Upgrade Program (under construction), estimated cost of \$172 million;
- ▶ Stanwell to Wycarbah Duplication (Gracemere to Wycarbah Duplication) (completed), estimated cost of \$72 million; and
- ▶ Westwood to Wycarbah Duplication (completed) estimated cost of \$32 million.

### 3.1.2 Major Existing and New Coal Projects – Rockhampton Regional Council & Hinterland

Major mine projects identified within this section are those that are likely to more directly influence economic outcomes in the Rockhampton region. This area generally relates to the Capricorn Highway Corridor between Rockhampton and Barcladine. There are likely to be a number of existing mines or proposed projects outside this corridor that may also provide stimulus to the Rockhampton region, but would have greater impacts elsewhere. There are approximately 18 existing coal mine projects within Central West with an expected production of 88 million tonnes of coal per annum and an estimated 8,785 jobs created.

Significant projects within Central West include the Blackwater BHP Billiton Mitsubishi Alliance (BMA) Coal mine, the Callide/Boundary Hill Anglo American Met Coal mine, the Rolleston Xstrata Coal Queensland Mine and the Dawson Anglo American Met Coal Mine. The Blackwater BMA mine is located at Blackwater and is an open cut mine with an expected production of 10.5 million tonnes of coking and thermal coal per year. An estimated 1,570 jobs will be created from its operation with a mine life to beyond 2040.

The Callide/Boundary Hill Anglo American Met Coal mine is located in Biloela and is an open cut mine with an expected production of 9.1 million tonnes of coking and thermal coal per year. The mine life of the project is anticipated to be beyond 2030 with 520 jobs created from its operation.

The Rolleston Xstrata Coal Queensland mine is located at Rolleston with the open cut mine having an expected production of 7.2 million tonnes of thermal coal per year. The mine life spans to beyond 2025 with 310 jobs created from its operation.

The Dawson Anglo American Met Coal mines, located at Moura, will process coking and thermal coal from three mine sites at Dawson Central, Dawson North and Dawson South. Total production expected from these three sites is 6.9 million tonnes per year providing an estimated 1,300 jobs over the mine life to beyond 2025.

There are approximately 26 new coal mine projects within Central West totalling \$11,896 million in capital expenditure. It must be noted that many proposed new projects do not proceed past the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) stage; therefore the list is just an indicative guide to possible projects.

Significant projects within Central West include the China First Waratah Coal Limited mine, the Alpha Hancock Coal mine, the Kevin's Corner Hancock Coal mine and the South Gaililee AMCI/Bandanna Energy Limited mine. The China First Waratah Coal mine is located in Alpha and is currently at the EIS stage with an expected start date of 2013. It is proposed to be both an open cut and underground mine with a Capex of \$3,180 million and production of 40 million tonnes of coal per year. Employment during construction is estimated to be 1,500 jobs with the same number also needed during the mines operating life.



The Alpha Hancock Coal mine, located in Alpha is currently at the Environmental Impact Assessment stage with the project anticipated to start in 2011. Its open cut operations have an expected production of 30 million tonnes coal per year, creating 1,500 jobs during construction and its operation life.

The Kevin's Corner Hancock Coal mine is also located at Alpha and currently undergoing the Environmental Impact Assessment stage with an expected project start date of 2014. The open cut and underground operations are estimated to produce 30 million tonnes of coal per year.

The South Galilee AMCI/Bandanna Energy mine is located at Alpha and is still in the early stages of progression. The proposed open cut and underground operations have an expected production of 20 million tonnes of coal per year whilst in operation.

## 3.2 Agricultural Production

Agricultural production within the study area is reported here in the following categories:

- ▶ Horticulture;
- ▶ Cropping; and
- ▶ Livestock.

The agricultural production data is reported by quantity (e.g. hectares of production, tonnage, etc) and, where available, by value of production<sup>2</sup>. Agricultural commodity tables are presented in **Appendix A**.

### 3.2.1 Horticulture

#### 3.2.1.1 Nurseries, Cut Flowers and Cultivated Turf

In 2005-06, there were approximately 59 hectares of land in Rockhampton Regional Council occupied by nurseries, cut flowers and cultivated turf, including 31 hectares of cultivated turf and 27 hectares of land occupied by nurseries. Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the majority of land occupied by nurseries, cut flowers and cultivated turf was located in the Fitzroy planning area (14 hectares) and Livingstone planning area (44 hectares). In Rockhampton Regional Council, the area of land occupied by nurseries, cut flowers and cultivated turf accounted for only a small proportion of the Queensland production area (1.3%).

The value of nurseries, cut flowers and cultivated turf in Rockhampton Regional Council in 2005-06 was \$6.08 million, accounting for 97.7% and 2.0% of Fitzroy SD and Queensland production by value respectively.

#### 3.2.1.2 Fruit (Area)

Fruit is not a significant commodity within Rockhampton Regional Council with limited or no land occupied by fruit in the planning areas. In Rockhampton Regional Council, the major fruit commodities in 2005-06 were other orchard fruit and plantation fruit, the majority of which was located within the Livingstone planning area. The number of other orchard fruit trees in the Livingstone planning area increased from 27,481 trees in 2000-01 to 218,574 trees in 2005-06, accounting for 8.4% of Queensland production area in 2005-06.

#### 3.2.1.3 Fruit (Production)

The volume of plantation fruit produced in Rockhampton Regional Council increased from 13,140 tonnes in 2000-01 to 16,417 tonnes in 2005-06, accounting for almost all of Fitzroy SD production and 5.1% of Queensland production. Although other orchard fruit in the Livingstone planning area accounted for 8.4% of Queensland production area in 2005-06, it accounted for less than 1% of the volume produced. This may be due to the fact that the number of other orchard fruit trees increased significantly in the Livingstone planning area between 2000-01 and 2005-06 and may not have been fully developed and producing fruit by 2005-06.

#### **3.2.1.4 Fruit (Value)**

The total value of fruit produced in Rockhampton Regional Council in 2005-06 was \$25.13 million, accounting for 2.8% of Queensland production by value. The value of other orchard fruit in the Livingstone planning area was \$15.62 million, accounting for 10.7% of Queensland production by value.

#### **3.2.1.5 Vegetables for Human Consumption (Area)**

Vegetables for human consumption is not a significant commodity within Rockhampton Regional Council with limited or no land occupied by vegetables in the Fitzroy, Livingstone, Mount Morgan and Rockhampton planning areas. In 2005-06, there were 307 hectares of land occupied by vegetables for human consumption commodities in Rockhampton Regional Council including 218 hectares in the Livingstone planning area. In 2005-06, there were 98 hectares of land occupied by sweet potatoes in the Livingstone planning area, accounting for 7.8% of the Queensland production area.

#### **3.2.1.6 Vegetables for Human Consumption (Production)**

The volume of vegetables produced for human consumption in Rockhampton Regional Council increased from 2,945 tonnes in 2000-01 to 6,170 tonnes in 2005-06, accounting for 41.3% of Fitzroy SD production but less than 1% of Queensland production. In Livingstone planning area, there were 3,902 tonnes of sweet potatoes produced in 2005-06, accounting for 11.2% of Queensland production.

#### **3.2.1.7 Vegetables for Human Consumption (Value)**

The total value of vegetables for human consumption in Rockhampton Regional Council in 2005-06 was \$2.43 million, accounting for less than 1% of Queensland production by value. Although sweet potatoes produced in Livingstone planning area accounted for 11.2% of Queensland production by value, they had a value of just \$4,058 in 2005-06.

### **3.2.2 Cropping**

#### **3.2.2.1 Crops**

In 2005-06, crops were not a significant agricultural commodity in Rockhampton Regional Council and accounted for only a small proportion crops in Queensland. Within Rockhampton Regional Council hay was the most significant crop commodity occupying 1,620 hectares and producing 10,608 tonnes in 2005-06. The value of hay in Rockhampton Regional Council in 2005-06 was \$2.17 million accounting for 1.9% of the Queensland production by value.

### **3.2.3 Livestock**

#### **3.2.3.1 Livestock (Production)**

In Rockhampton Regional Council, the most significant livestock commodity was meat cattle decreasing from 281,824 head in 2000-01 to 248,633 head in 2005-06, or 2.2% of Queensland production in 2005-06. Meat cattle within Rockhampton Regional Council included 107,945 head in the Fitzroy planning area, 135,034 head in the Livingstone planning area, 4,493 head in the Mount Morgan planning area and 1,161 head in the Rockhampton planning area. The sale of horses within Rockhampton Regional Council accounted for 23.2% of the sale of horses in Queensland in 2005-06.



### 3.2.3.2 Livestock Slaughtered (Value)

In 2005-06, the total value of slaughtered livestock in Rockhampton Regional Council was \$82.38 million, accounting for 2.0% of Queensland production by value, including:

- ▶ \$50.33 million in Fitzroy planning area;
- ▶ \$29.18 million in Livingstone planning area;
- ▶ \$2.41 million in Mount Morgan planning area; and
- ▶ \$0.46 million in Rockhampton planning area.

In all regions slaughtered cattle and calves accounted for the majority of the total value of slaughtered livestock.

### 3.2.3.3 Livestock Products (Value)

The total value of livestock products in 2005-06 was \$4.06 million in Rockhampton Regional Council accounting for 1.0% of Queensland production by value. In Rockhampton Regional Council, the most significant livestock product in terms of value was milk (\$2.26 million) accounting for over half of the total livestock products value.

### 3.2.4 Summary

Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the majority of land occupied by horticulture and cropping commodities is located in the Fitzroy and Livingstone planning areas. Only a small area of land in the Rockhampton planning area and no land in the Mount Morgan planning area is occupied by horticulture and cropping commodities. Livestock commodities are located within all of the component planning areas within Rockhampton Regional Council however, the value of livestock commodities in Rockhampton Regional Council does not contribute significantly to Queensland.

The value of horticulture, cropping and livestock commodities in Rockhampton Regional Council did not contribute significantly to Queensland production by value in 2005-06. The most significant commodities in Rockhampton Regional Council in 2005-06 were:

- ▶ Other orchard fruit;
- ▶ Plantation fruit;
- ▶ Sweet potatoes;
- ▶ Hay; and
- ▶ Meat cattle.



## 4. Industrial Futures Diagnostics

The purpose of the industrial futures diagnostics is to objectively assess potential opportunities for development of new and emerging industry sectors and the potential expansion or evolution of existing industry sectors by identifying the region's locational advantages, resources and capabilities.

The analysis identifies industry sectors in which the region possesses a competitive advantage and then identifies those sectors' supply chain and customer market sectors. Potential opportunities are identified by considering the opportunity for supply chain and customer market sectors to establish within the region.

### 4.1 Identification of Regionally Competitive Sectors

#### 4.1.1 Shift – Share Analysis

Shift-share analysis looks at the changing mix of employment within a given region and indicates whether employment in each industry sector is shifting towards or away from the region.

Shift-share analysis has been conducted on the resident population for Rockhampton Regional Council between the 1996 and 2006 period<sup>3</sup>.

Between 1996 and 2006, employment within Rockhampton Regional Council has increased by 8,044 persons, with the increase higher in the 2001 to 2006 period, including:

- ▶ 663 persons in the Fitzroy planning area;
- ▶ 3,050 persons in the Livingstone planning area;
- ▶ 85 persons in the Mount Morgan planning area; and
- ▶ 1,867 persons in the Rockhampton planning area.

Within the Rockhampton Regional Council key sectors of growth in the 1996 to 2006 period were:

- ▶ Construction – increase of 1,337 persons or 22.1% of total growth;
- ▶ Health care and social assistance – increase of 882 persons or 14.6% of total growth;
- ▶ Retail trade – increase of 763 persons or 12.6% of total growth;
- ▶ Mining – increase of 703 persons or 11.6% of total growth; and
- ▶ Education and training – increase of 625 persons or 10.3% of total growth.

The agriculture, forestry and fishing, wholesale trade, information media and telecommunications, and financial and insurance services sectors recorded a decline in employment between 1996 and 2006. The financial and insurance services sector recorded an increase in employment between 2001 and 2006.

#### 4.1.2 Location Quotient Analysis

Location quotient analysis compares the industry structure of the local economy to the industry structure of the reference economy to identify specialisations in the local economy. A location quotient exceeding one would suggest that the local economy is more concentrated in the industry sector than the reference economy.

As of the 2006 Census of Population and Housing, the most significant industries of employment in Rockhampton Regional Council were:

- ▶ Retail trade (12.8% of total employment);
- ▶ Health care and social assistance (12.5% of total employment); and
- ▶ Education and training (11.1% of total employment).

Retail trade, health care and social assistance and education and training all recorded a location quotient greater than one relative to Queensland.

Within Rockhampton Regional Council, industry sectors which accounted for a significant proportion of employment with a high location quotient relative to Queensland include:

- ▶ Agriculture, forestry and fishing:
  - Fitzroy planning area (20.0% of employment, LQ of 5.85 relative to Queensland);
  - Livingstone planning area (8.2% of employment, LQ of 2.40 relative to Queensland); and
  - Mount Morgan planning area (4.8% of employment, LQ of 1.39 relative to Queensland);
- ▶ Mining:
  - Mount Morgan planning area (4.5% of employment, LQ of 2.70 relative to Queensland);
- ▶ Electricity, gas, water and waste services:
  - Fitzroy planning area (10.4% of employment, LQ of 10.01 relative to Queensland); and
  - Rockhampton planning area (2.8% of employment, LQ of 2.72 relative to Queensland);
- ▶ Accommodation and food services:
  - Livingstone planning area (13.2% of employment, LQ of 1.89 relative to Queensland);
- ▶ Transport, postal and warehousing:
  - Fitzroy planning area (10.3% of employment, LQ of 2.04 relative to Queensland);
- ▶ Public administration and safety:
  - Livingstone planning area (7.7% of employment, LQ of 1.13 relative to Queensland); and
  - Mount Morgan planning area (8.8% of employment, LQ of 1.28 relative to Queensland).

## 4.2 Supply Chain and Customer Sectors

### 4.2.1 Identification of Major Supplier and Customer Sectors

This section summarises the major inter-industry transactions of the key industries within the Rockhampton Regional Council, as identified in Section 4.1 of the report, namely:

- ▶ Agriculture, forestry and fishing, in particular agriculture (beef, dairy, pigs and other agriculture);
- ▶ Mining, in particular coal mining;
- ▶ Electricity, gas and water supply;
- ▶ Retail trade;
- ▶ Accommodation and food services;
- ▶ Transport, postal and warehousing, in particular road transport and rail transport;
- ▶ Education and training;
- ▶ Health care and social assistance; and
- ▶ Public administration and safety.

The analysis of inter-industry transactions is based on the 2004-05 Australian Input-Output tables. While these input-output tables are over five years old, it is considered unlikely that there has been a significant change in the structural inter-dependence of the key industries within the Rockhampton regional economy<sup>4</sup>.

The 2004-05 Australian Input-Output tables are expressed at the 1993 ANZSIC three digit level, but the key industries identified in the shift-share analysis and location quotient analysis were conducted at the one digit 2006 ANZSIC level.

**Table 4-3** below summarises the concordance between the key industries identified (at the 2006 ANZSIC one/two digit level) and the component sub-sectors as identified in the 2004-05 Australian input-output tables (at the 1993 ANZSIC three digit level).

For each industry sector identified, the major supplier and customer industry sectors were identified based on their relative significance in terms of either sales to or purchases from the subject industry sector. Supplier and customer industry sectors were grouped into the following broad categories:

- ▶ Primary industries;
- ▶ Secondary industries;
- ▶ Tertiary industries;
- ▶ Quaternary industries; and
- ▶ Quinary industries.

The above categories provide a hierarchy of industries from the supply of commodities (primary industry) to the provision of higher order services, such as health and community services, and cultural and recreational services (quinary industry).

**Table 4-4** below provides a summary of the classification of industry sectors (at the 1993 ANZSIC three digit level) into broad industry categories.

#### 4.2.2 Summary

From each of the key industry sectors identified in Rockhampton Regional Council, the three most significant supply chain and customer sectors were identified based on the detailed supply chain and customer market analysis of the key regionally competitive industry sectors (refer to **Table 4-3** above) contained in **Appendix B**. The analysis then identified the most common supply chain and customer sectors for all key industry sectors within Rockhampton Regional Council.

Overall, the most significant key sectors supplying enterprises within Rockhampton Regional Council are:

- ▶ Legal, accounting, marketing and business management services;
- ▶ Other property services;
- ▶ Wholesale trade;
- ▶ Medicinal and pharmaceutical products, pesticides manufacturing;
- ▶ Services to agriculture, hunting and trapping;
- ▶ Construction trade services;
- ▶ Other food products manufacturing;
- ▶ Communication services; and
- ▶ Other business services.

The most significant sectors being supplied by enterprises within Rockhampton Regional Council are:

- ▶ Retail trade;
- ▶ Accommodation, cafes and restaurants;
- ▶ Wholesale trade;
- ▶ Meat and meat products manufacturing;
- ▶ Electricity supply;
- ▶ Other business services;
- ▶ Road transport;
- ▶ Scientific research, technical and computer services;
- ▶ Legal, accounting, marketing and business management services; and
- ▶ Education.

## 5. Rockhampton Regional Council sub area analysis

### 5.1 Definition of Sub Areas

A total of 21 sub areas were defined within Rockhampton Regional Council based on existing and planned activity within Rockhampton Regional Council and its component planning areas. The sub areas were defined based on Census collection district boundaries, the smallest geographic area defined in the Australian Standard Geographical Classification.

The sub areas within each planning area are as follows:

- ▶ Fitzroy planning area:
  - Gracemere;
  - Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
  - Fitzroy Rural;
- ▶ Livingstone planning area:
  - Emu Park and Surrounds;
  - Kinka Beach and Surrounds;
  - Livingstone Rural Balance;
  - The Caves/Rockyview; and
  - Yeppoon and Surrounds;
- ▶ Mount Morgan planning area:
  - Mount Morgan Township; and
  - Mount Morgan Rural;
- ▶ Rockhampton planning area:
  - Airport;
  - CBD;
  - North Rockhampton Balance;
  - North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
  - North Rockhampton Industrial;
  - North Rockhampton Residential;
  - Parkhurst- Kawana Industrial Corridor;
  - South Rockhampton Industrial;
  - South Rockhampton Balance;
  - South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and
  - South Rockhampton Residential.

**Figure 5-1** outlines the geographic boundaries of the sub areas identified within Rockhampton Regional Council. **Figure 5-2** provides a detailed map of the geographic boundaries of the sub areas within Rockhampton planning area.



Figure 5-1 Rockhampton Regional Council Sub Areas

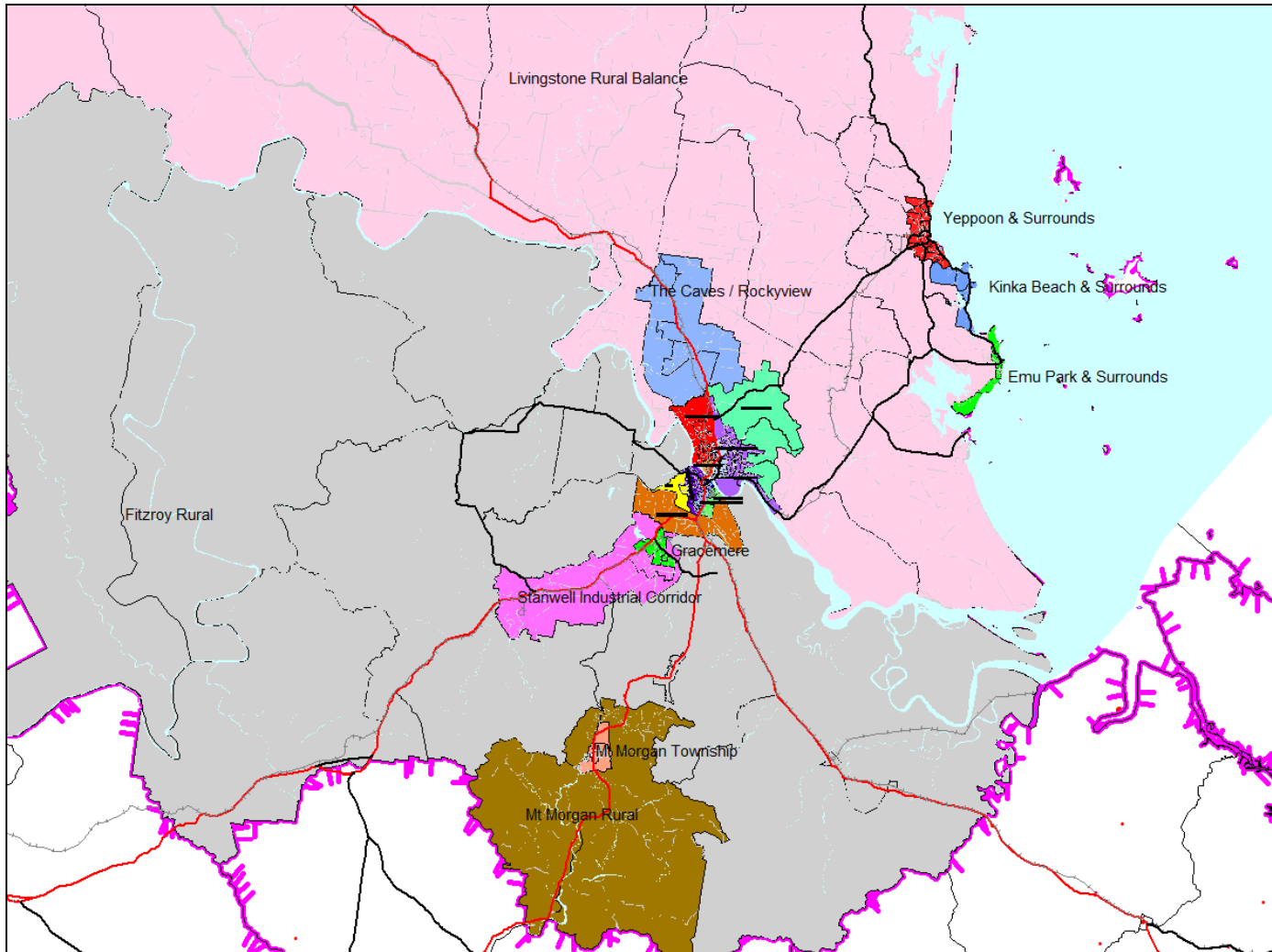
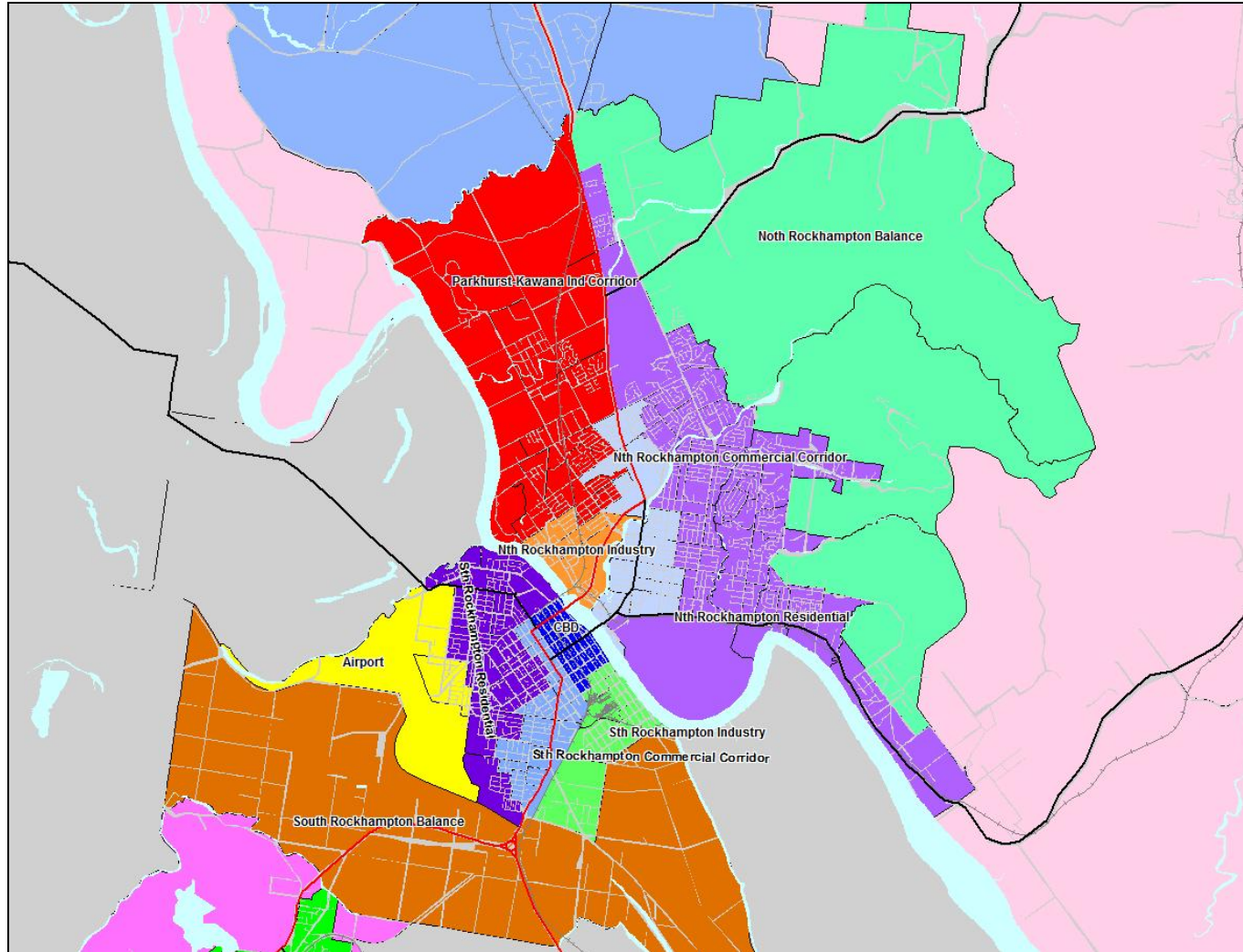




Figure 5-2 Rockhampton Planning Area Sub Areas



## 5.2 Socio-Economic Overview of Sub Areas

The socio-economic characteristics of the identified sub areas are based on the 2006 Census of Population and Housing and benchmarked against Queensland. A number of key points can be drawn from this profile, these being:

- ▶ In 2006, there were 10,225 persons living in the Fitzroy planning area<sup>5</sup>, including:
  - 4,450 persons living in Gracemere;
  - 1,729 persons living in Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
  - 4,406 persons living in the Fitzroy Rural area;
- ▶ There were 27,833 persons living in the Livingstone planning area, including:
  - 2,877 persons living in Emu Park and Surrounds;
  - 1,561 persons living in Kinka Beach and Surrounds;
  - 8,516 persons living in Livingstone Rural Balance;
  - 3,445 persons living in The Caves/Rockyview; and
  - 11,434 persons living in Yeppoon and Surrounds;
- ▶ There were 2,974 persons living in Mount Morgan planning area, including:
  - 2,173 persons living in Mount Morgan Township; and
  - 801 persons living in the Mount Morgan rural area;
- ▶ There were 58,529 persons living in the Rockhampton planning area, including:
  - 833 persons living in the Airport area;
  - 1,053 persons living in the CBD;
  - 589 persons living in the North Rockhampton Balance area;
  - 7,193 persons living in the North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
  - 1,791 persons living in the North Rockhampton Industrial area;
  - 24,446 persons living in the North Rockhampton Residential area;
  - 6,896 persons living in the Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor;
  - 1,484 persons living in the South Rockhampton Industrial area;
  - 126 persons living in the South Rockhampton Balance area;
  - 4,175 persons living in the South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and
  - 9,944 persons living in the South Rockhampton Residential area;
- ▶ The Gracemere, Stanwell Industrial Corridor, Fitzroy Rural, The Caves/Rockyview, North Rockhampton Balance, North Rockhampton Residential and Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor sub areas are characterised by young couple family with children households. In 2006, the Gracemere, North Rockhampton Residential and Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor sub areas recorded a higher proportion of single parent family households than Queensland;

- ▶ The Emu Park and Surrounds, Kinka Beach and Surrounds, Mount Morgan Township, South Rockhampton Balance and South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor sub areas all had a relatively mature population with each sub area recording a significantly higher average age of residents than Queensland in 2006. The incidence of persons aged 65 years and over was higher in these sub areas (all above 18%) than Queensland (12.4%);
- ▶ The proportion of persons aged 15 to 34 years was significantly lower in the Emu Park and Surrounds, Kinka Beach and Surrounds, Livingstone Rural Balance, Mount Morgan Township, Mount Morgan Rural and South Rockhampton Balance sub areas than in Queensland;
- ▶ In the Kinka Beach and Surrounds, Mount Morgan Township and Mount Morgan Rural sub areas, over 48% of households fully own their home compared to 31.6% in Queensland. A significantly lower proportion of households were renting in the Stanwell Industrial Corridor, Fitzroy Rural, Livingstone Rural Balance, The Caves/Rockyview, Mount Morgan Rural, North Rockhampton Balance and South Rockhampton Balance sub areas compared to Queensland;
- ▶ Households within the Emu Park and Surrounds, Mount Morgan Township, CBD, North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor, North Rockhampton Industrial and South Rockhampton Industrial sub areas generally earn a lower average weekly income (less than \$1,000) than Queensland (\$1,202). Households within The Caves/Rockyview, Mount Morgan Rural and North Rockhampton Balance sub areas generally earn a higher average weekly income (more than \$1,500) than Queensland;
- ▶ Average monthly housing loan repayments were lower in the sub areas than Queensland (\$1,446), with the exception of the Kinka Beach and Surrounds sub area (\$1,502). The sub areas recorded lower average weekly rents than Queensland;
- ▶ Unemployment rates of above 10% were recorded in the Mount Morgan Township, Mount Morgan Rural, CBD and South Rockhampton Industrial sub areas. Unemployment rates in the Stanwell Industrial Corridor, Fitzroy Rural, Livingstone Rural Balance, The Caves/Rockyview and North Rockhampton Balance sub areas were significantly lower than Queensland (4.7%);
- ▶ Low participation rates (below 50%) were recorded in the Emu Park and Surrounds, Mount Morgan Township and Mount Morgan Rural sub areas compared to Queensland (61.8%). High participation rates (above 70%) were recorded in The Caves/Rockyview and North Rockhampton Balance sub areas compared to Queensland.
- ▶ Kinka Beach and Surrounds and The Caves/Rockyview sub areas recorded a high proportion of the population with a post-school qualification compared to Queensland, while Mount Morgan Township, Mount Morgan Rural, CBD and South Rockhampton Industrial sub areas recorded a significantly lower proportion of the population with a post-school qualification than Queensland;
- ▶ The sub areas generally recorded a higher proportion of blue collar workers than Queensland. Lower blue collar workers accounted for over 30% of employment in the Mount Morgan Township, Mount Morgan Rural, CBD, North Rockhampton Industrial and South Rockhampton Industrial sub areas. The Kinka Beach and Surrounds, South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor and South Rockhampton Residential sub areas recorded a higher proportion of persons employed in upper white collar professions (over 30%) than the other sub areas analysed and Queensland;
- ▶ Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the Airport, Gracemere, Stanwell Industrial Corridor, Mount Morgan Rural, North Rockhampton Balance, North Rockhampton Industrial, Parkhurst-





Kawana Industrial Corridor sub areas are industrial areas which typically recorded a high proportion of employment in the manufacturing, construction, wholesale trade and/or transport, postal and warehousing sectors relative to Queensland;

- ▶ The Fitzroy Rural, Livingstone Rural and South Rockhampton Balance sub areas are agricultural areas with a higher proportion of persons employed in the agriculture, forestry and fishing sector than Queensland;
- ▶ The Emu Park and Surrounds, Kinka Beach and Surrounds, The Caves/Rockyview, Yeppoon and Surrounds, Mount Morgan Township, North and South Rockhampton Commercial Corridors and North and South Rockhampton Residential sub areas generally recorded a higher proportion of persons employed in the education and training, and/or health care and social assistance sectors than Queensland;
- ▶ The Rockhampton CBD sub area recorded a higher proportion of persons employed in accommodation and food services than the other sub areas and Queensland; and
- ▶ The Fitzroy, Livingstone and Mount Morgan sub areas recorded a higher proportion of persons employed in the mining and electricity, gas, water and waste services than Queensland, with the exception of the mining sector in Mount Morgan Township sub area.





## 6. Employment & Land Use Projections

This section of the report presents the findings of the employment projections for each of the planning areas within Rockhampton Regional Council. Estimates have then been allocated to the sub areas, based on priority infrastructure planning (PIP) data provided by Rockhampton Regional Council, and anticipated growth trends within each sub area.

For each sub area, the net land required to accommodate the following uses has also been identified:

- ▶ Industrial;
- ▶ Commercial office;
- ▶ Retail;
- ▶ Education;
- ▶ Health;
- ▶ Public order & safety; and
- ▶ Other (hospitality, sport & recreation & similar).

Employment estimates at the two digit ANZSIC level are provided in **Appendix D** for each sub area.

### 6.1 Projected Employment by Planning Area

#### 6.1.1 Methodology

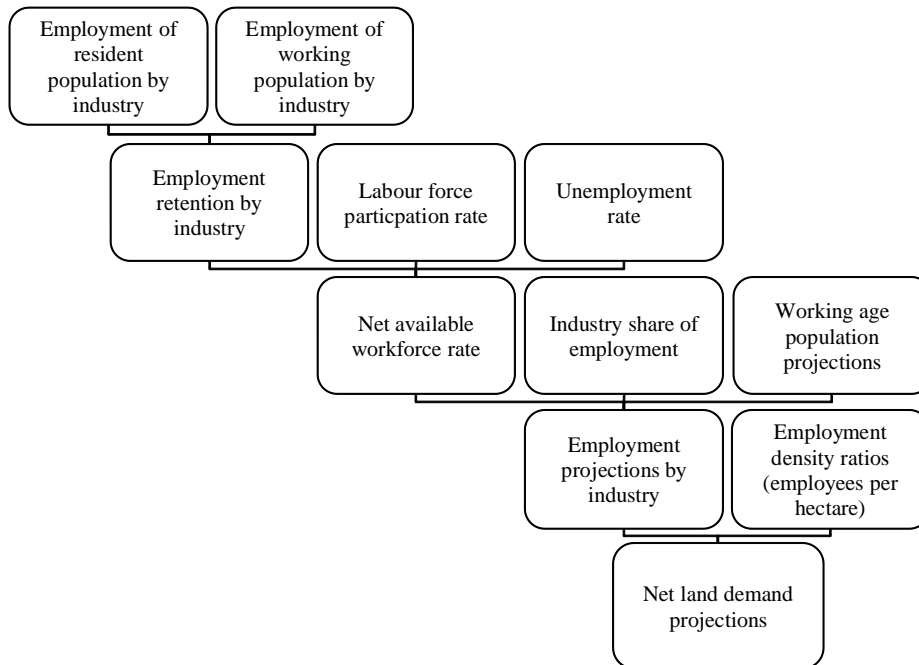
Employment and net land demand projections in this report are based on a number of factors, including:

- ▶ The net available workforce rate, which is derived using:
  - Employment retention (or jobs balance) rates by industry sector (resident population employment by industry divided by working population by industry); and
  - Labour force participation and unemployment rates.
- ▶ Industry share of employment for relevant sectors; and
- ▶ Working age (persons aged 15 to 64 years) population projections.

Net land demand (or allotment demand) is derived by applying employment density ratios (employees per hectare) for each industry sector to the employment projections.

**Figure 6.1** below is a flowchart of the process of calculating employment and net land demand projections.

### 6.1.2 Employment and Population Growth

Precisely predicting employment levels into the future is difficult, because of the cyclical nature of economic activity and employment. As of the 2006 Census of Population and Housing, the 15 to 64 year unemployment rates within Rockhampton Regional Council were:

- ▶ Fitzroy planning area – 4.1%;
- ▶ Livingstone planning area – 4.6%;
- ▶ Mount Morgan planning area – 15.3%; and
- ▶ Rockhampton planning area – 5.8%.

The unemployment rates throughout Rockhampton Regional Council were significantly lower in 2006 than in previous Census years. For the Fitzroy, Livingstone and Rockhampton planning areas, it has been assumed that the unemployment rate will trend upwards to 80% of the historical average by 2031. In the Mount Morgan planning area, it has been assumed that the unemployment rate will continue to fall, reaching 10.0% by 2031.

**Table 6.1** below summarises the assumed 15 to 64 year unemployment rates in Rockhampton Regional Council and its component planning areas between 2006 and 2031.

The labour force participation rates for the 15 to 64 population as of the 2006 Census of Population and Housing were:

- ▶ Fitzroy planning area – 70.5%;
- ▶ Livingstone planning area – 66.1%;
- ▶ Mount Morgan planning area – 47.1%; and
- ▶ Rockhampton planning area – 70.9%.

In the Fitzroy, Livingstone and Rockhampton planning areas, it has been assumed that labour force participation will increase by 2.5% by 2031. In Mount Morgan planning area, it has been assumed that the labour force participation rate will increase significantly, reaching 60.0% by 2031.

### 6.1.3 Employment Assumptions

In addition to anticipated unemployment levels and labour force participation, the employment modelling supporting this assessment makes a number of assumptions regarding:

- ▶ Jobs balance by industry sector: the ratio of employed persons by place of residence and employed persons by place of work; and
- ▶ Employment by industry sector: the percentage of the working population employed in particular industry sectors.

#### 6.1.3.1 Employment Retention

Employment retention (also known as 'jobs balance') refers to the share of the resident workforce by industry (employment by industry by place of residence) that is retained within a particular region.

The ratio is as follows:



(Employment by industry by place of employment) divided by (Employment by industry by place of residence)

An employment retention rate of less than 100% indicates that some employed residents of a particular region work in a different region (i.e. employment leakage). Employment retention rates greater than 100% suggest a net inflow of workers within that sector from other regions.

Detailed tables outlining the trends in employment retention at the two digit level can be found in **Appendix C** of the report.

### 6.1.3.2 Projected Industry by Employment Share

The economic structure of Rockhampton Regional Council and its component sub-regions is expected to evolve throughout the projection period. These changes are likely to be gradual, however major developments may result in a significant restructuring of the economy. Assumptions made regarding the likely economic structural change within Rockhampton Regional Council and its component sub-regions have been based on consultation findings, regional planning intents, regional input-output tables, a review of recent development applications and approvals, major projects proposed for the region and the findings of field investigations.

Detailed tables outlining the trends in projected employment by industry at the two digit level can be found in **Appendix C** of the report.

#### 6.1.4 Projected Employment

By 2031, employment in Rockhampton Regional Council is projected to be 54,686 persons, comprising:

- ▶ 4,509 persons in the Fitzroy planning area;
- ▶ 11,424 persons in the Livingstone planning area;
- ▶ 579 persons in the Mount Morgan planning area; and
- ▶ 38,174 persons in the Rockhampton planning area.

Within Rockhampton Regional Council, the sectors anticipated to record the most significant increases in employment are:

- ▶ Manufacturing (additional 1,470 employed);
- ▶ Retail trade (additional 1,240 employed);
- ▶ Health care and social assistance (additional 1,170 employed); and
- ▶ Education and training (additional 1,110 employed).

**Table 6-4** below summarises projected employment by planning area at the one digit ANZSIC level between 2010 and 2031. **Appendix C** summarises projected employment by industry at the two digit level by planning area.

## 6.2 Projected Employment by Sub Area

Employment estimates have been allocated to sub areas based on current land use, based on PIP data provided by Rockhampton Regional Council, with growth allocated based on future land intents within each sub area.

### 6.2.1 Existing Land Use

Rockhampton Regional Council provided PIP data by collection district by gross floor area (GFA) for 43 Queensland Planning Provision (QPP) land uses. As required by the project terms of reference, these 43 land uses were aggregated into the following categories:

- ▶ Industrial;
- ▶ Commercial office;
- ▶ Retail;
- ▶ Education;
- ▶ Health;
- ▶ Public order & safety; and
- ▶ Other (hospitality, sport & recreation & similar).

The land uses were then converted to employment estimates, based on employment density assumptions made for each category. **Table 6-5** below provides a summary of the estimated distribution of employment within each planning area.

## 6.2.2 Projected Employment

### 6.2.2.1 Fitzroy Planning Area

By 2031, employment within the Fitzroy planning area is projected to be:

- ▶ 2,044 persons in Gracemere;
- ▶ 1,736 persons in Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
- ▶ 729 persons in Fitzroy Rural.

Within Gracemere, employment is projected to be highest in the other (779 persons by 2031), commercial office (306 persons by 2031) and industrial (300 persons by 2031) sectors.

Within the Stanwell Industrial Corridor, the majority of employment is anticipated to be in the industrial sector increasing from 469 persons in 2010 to 1,453 persons in 2031. Within Fitzroy Rural, employment is projected to be highest in the other sector increasing from 293 persons in 2010 to 525 persons in 2031.

### 6.2.2.2 Livingstone Planning Area

By 2031, employment within the Livingstone planning area is projected to be:

- ▶ 877 persons in Emu Park & Surrounds;
- ▶ 312 persons in Kinka Beach & Surrounds;
- ▶ 2,389 persons in Livingstone Rural Balance;
- ▶ 564 persons in The Caves / Rockyview; and
- ▶ 7,263 persons in Yeppoon & Surrounds.

Within Emu Park & Surrounds, employment is projected to be highest in the other (401 persons by 2031) and health (182 persons by 2031) sectors. Within Kinka Beach & Surrounds and Livingstone Rural Balance, the majority of employment is anticipated to be within other (148 and 1,000 persons by 2031 respectively) and industrial (144 and 968 persons by 2031 respectively). Employment within The Caves / Rockyview sub area is projected to be highest in public order and safety (278 persons by 2031) and other (196 persons by 2031).

Within the Livingstone planning area, Yeppoon & Surrounds is the most significant sub area in terms of employment. By 2031, employment is projected to be highest in the commercial office (1,665 persons), other (1,536 persons) and industrial (1,326 persons) sectors.

Within the Mount Morgan planning area, employment within the sub areas in 2031 is projected to be:

- ▶ 534 persons in Mount Morgan Township; and
- ▶ 44 persons in Mount Morgan Rural.

Within Mount Morgan Township, employment is projected to be highest in the health (141 persons by 2031) and education (102 persons by 2031) sectors. In Mount Morgan Rural, the majority of employment is anticipated to be split between industrial (20 persons by 2031) and other (14 persons by 2031).

#### 6.2.2.4 Rockhampton Planning Area

By 2031, employment in the sub areas of Rockhampton planning area is projected to be:

- ▶ 615 persons in the Airport;
- ▶ 8,516 persons in the CBD;
- ▶ 106 persons in Rockhampton Balance;
- ▶ 4,648 persons in the North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor;
- ▶ 1,906 persons in North Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 4,584 persons in North Rockhampton Residential;
- ▶ 6,564 persons in the Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor;
- ▶ 2,041 persons in South Rockhampton Industrial;
- ▶ 201 persons in South Rockhampton Balance;
- ▶ 3,844 persons in the South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor; and
- ▶ 5,148 persons in South Rockhampton Residential.



The majority of employment in the Airport sub area is split between public order and safety (322 persons by 2031) and industrial (197 persons by 2031). In the CBD, employment is anticipated to be highest in the commercial office (4,032 persons by 2031), other (1,875 persons by 2031) and retail (1,284 persons by 2031) sectors.

The majority of employment in the North Rockhampton Balance sub area is projected to be in other (103 persons by 2031). Employment in the North Rockhampton Commercial Corridor is anticipated to be highest in the retail (1,961 persons by 2031), commercial office (644 persons by 2031) and other (641 persons by 2031) sectors.

The industrial sector is anticipated to account for a significant proportion of employment (over 45%) in the North Rockhampton Industrial (889 persons by 2031), Parkhurst-Kawana Industrial Corridor (4,662 persons by 2031), South Rockhampton Industrial (1,492 persons by 2031) and South Rockhampton Balance (169 persons by 2031) sub areas.

In the North Rockhampton Residential sub area employment is projected to be highest in the education (1,525 persons by 2031) and other (1,091 persons by 2031) sectors. In the South Rockhampton Commercial Corridor, employment is anticipated to be highest in the other (958 persons by 2031) and health (805 persons by 2031) sectors. In the South Rockhampton Residential sub area employment is anticipated to be highest in the health (2,542 persons by 2031) and education (1,160 persons by 2031) sectors.

### 6.3 Projected Net Land Demand

Employment estimates have been converted into net land demand estimates, using the following employment densities:

- ▶ Industrial – 25 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Commercial office – 250 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Retail – 170 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Education – 100 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Health – 100 employees per hectare;
- ▶ Other – 100 employees per hectare; and
- ▶ Public order & safety – 100 employees per hectare.

These employment densities have been derived through consultation with key stakeholders in Rockhampton Regional Council and from previous consultancies in Central Queensland.

#### 6.3.1 Fitzroy Planning Area

By 2031, within Fitzroy Planning Area there is projected to be net incremental land demand of 53.1 hectares, comprising:

- ▶ 8.6 hectares in Gracemere;
- ▶ 39.8 hectares in Stanwell Industrial Corridor; and
- ▶ 4.7 hectares in Fitzroy Rural.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand within all sub areas, accounting for 82.3% of net incremental demand in 2031.

### 6.3.2 Livingstone Planning Area

By 2031, within Livingstone Planning Area there is projected to be net incremental land demand of 56.9 hectares, comprising:

- ▶ 2.4 hectares in Emu Park & Surrounds;
- ▶ 1.8 hectares in Kinka Beach & Surrounds;
- ▶ 18.0 hectares in Livingstone Rural Balance;
- ▶ 1.9 hectares in The Caves / Rockyview; and
- ▶ 32.9 hectares in Yeppoon & Surrounds.

Industrial is anticipated to be a key driver of net incremental land demand, accounting for 59.3% of net incremental demand in Livingstone Planning Area in 2031.
