Overview of the Artist Educator role

Artist Educators are key in the active delivery of engaging public programs at Rockhampton Museum of Art. We believe that Artist Educators are the creative energy that can drive and challenge our participants to take risks, explore meaning and engage with art and our Collection.

Artist Educators are essential in fostering creative learning, critical thinking and encourage risk taking in a safe and supported environment for programs participants. They are focused on provoking curiosity in a welcoming environment; they stimulate imagination and creativity, while providing both formal and informal learning opportunities across a wide range of audiences.

Tasks and Responsibilities

Artist Educators will directly develop, facilitate and reflect on programs they deliver to audiences. The art programs may take place before, during or after opening hours. Programs may take place in programs rooms at Rockhampton Museum of Art or at offsite locations as required. Programs can range in length from short 30-minute sessions to longer form specialist masterclasses held over a weekend, weekly or an intensive full day event.

This position will work within Rockhampton Museum of Art engagement and learning team to deliver a variety of public programs, such as:

1. Adult workshops and Masterclasses
2. Evening events and performances
3. Holiday and after-school programs
4. Parties and celebratory events
5. Lectures and talks
6. Online content

Artist Educators can be both traditional and contemporary artists or arts workers, varying across creative fields (eg. academia, painting, sculpting, performing, crafting) – Artists Educators are enthusiastic about sharing their practice and knowledge. Artist Educators will:

- Undertake the practical delivery of an allocated art program or event.
- Set-up and clean-up workshop spaces before and after allocated program
- Follow existing Rockhampton Museum of Art work processes, procedures and systems
- Observe requirements of the WHS Legislation, relevant to the job and adhere to Rockhampton Regional Council Policies and Procedures regarding WHS
- Observe appropriate Rockhampton Regional Council Policies and Procedures regarding operations including Equal Employment Opportunity policies, Rockhampton Regional Council's Dress Code and Standards Policy and Rockhampton Regional Council's Code of Conduct.

Eligibility

- Applicants must have an ABN and hold Public Liability for \$10M
- Applicants must have or be willing to obtain appropriate Workplace Health and Safety and Public Liability Insurance (\$10M) to be eligible and will be required to provide all relevant tickets and licences.
- Applicant must have or be willing to obtain appropriate Blue Card qualifications

Rockhampton Museum of Art is offering a contracted hourly rate of \$50.00 (or per experience). Work availability pending event type and demand.
