RECENT PROJECT ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

Snag Wagon: This major project will see the development and construction of a snag wagon that will be used to increase our fundraising capability and therefore our ability to assist the local community. Construction of the 'trailer' has commenced and this work is being carried out by a local business.

Athelstane Tennis Club: Were assisted by preparation of some additional (second hand) light poles for their lower courts. As a follow up we were invited back in October for a BBQ to thank all involved in helping the club get the lights up and running.

Sand Sink: Made at the request of the Gundanoo Child Care. Centre This is a great asset to their sand play area..

North Rockhampton Nursing Centre: Have been provided with a number of timber animal shape cutouts which the residents enjoy painting during craft sessions..

Breast Cancer Awareness: The Men's Shed again were able to support the local effort of raising awareness of Breast Cancer. Eight (8) Pink Ladies were made for Breast Screening Queensland.

Buddy Seating: Two new buddy seats were made for the Frenchville Primary School with some material costs being provided by the School.

Cyclone Marcia: Assistance to: the Rockhampton Horse Riding School to clear debris from fences.











HEALTH ISSUE PRESENTATIONS

We are hoping to have regular presentations on a range of relevant health topics. Recently we were informed of the Community Awareness Program for Dementia Friendly communities on behalf of Alzheimer's Australia (Qld) Limited. The presentation by our guest speaker Heidi Fillsell from the Rockhampton Dementia Support Centre was informative and well received.



RECRUITMENT DRIVE

We are undertaking a recruitment drive to increase our membership of men with some knowledge and skill in woodwork, metalwork or both.

SHED DEVELOPMENT

Over the last few months we have made substantial improvements to our shed through the acquisition of a number of new items of plant and equipment including:

Heavy duty thicknesser. Biscuit cutter Bobbin sander Band saw 300 mm disc sander Belt and disc sander

Training is underway to ensure that the members can use the new equipment competently and safely.

More shelving has been constructed in our storage area (Boggo Road) and the metal workshop is also undergoing some structural changes to improve workshop layout.

MONTHLY BBQS

A regular monthly BBQ has been organised to bring Shed members and PCYC staff together for a social gathering. These BBQ's are held on the last Tuesday or Thursday of each month, in rotation. The first BBQ was held at the end of October and was a great success.

IGA SAUSAGE SIZZLES

Our regular Sausage Sizzles at IGA Glenmore are still as popular as ever and is one of our main sources of income.

MENTORING LOCAL YOUTH

Consistent with the Shed's focus we are providing some support to local youth who are looking to gain some basic trade skills with mentoring being provided by shed members. Currently two young men are spending time at the shed and learning the basic skills of welding and mechanics. These young men are enjoying their time at the shed almost as much as the members enjoy passing on their knowledge in these areas. It is hoped that if we are able to recruit more new skilled members, we may be in a position to increase the number of youth we are able to assist under this mentoring program.

OUR NEW SNAG WAGON

This exciting new project has now entered the construction phase with a tender being let to a local engineering company to manufacture the trailer (Snag Wagon). This has been achieved through the generosity of sponsors and donors such as AFS Pharmacies, Arrow Pharmaceuticals, Infinity Power/Solar, Bill Byrne the Member for Rockhampton and a grant provided through the Rockhampton Regional Council.

The Snag Wagon will provide the opportunity for the Men's Shed to:

- Fundraise towards maintaining its own viability and growth.
- Support various community events (by providing sausage sizzle services).
- Spread the word about the Men's Shed movement.
- Disseminate the important "Men's Health" message/issues through the community.
