FIVE STEPS TO GET READY FOR AN EARTHQUAKE

STEP ONE -UNDERSTAND YOUR RISK

What is an earthquake?

EARTHQUAKES are the vibrations caused by rocks breaking under stress. The underground surface along which the rock breaks is called a fault plane. Depending on the size of the earthquake, strong and potentially destructive ground shaking may occur up to tens or even hundreds of kilometres from an earthquake epicentre.

Over the last sixty years there have been approximately 70 tremors measured and reported in the Rockhampton Region, although these tend to be very minor. The likelihood of an earthquake causing damage in the Rockhampton Region is possible although would be a rare occurrence.

Earthquake damage and impact

The impact of earthquakes is dependent on their scale as outlined below. Earthquakes with magnitudes of less than 3.5 seldom cause damage.

Magnitude	Intensity and impact
2.5 or less	Usually not felt, but can be recorded by seismograph
2.6 to 5.4	Often felt, but only causes minor damage
5.5 to 6	Slight damage to buildings and other structures
6.1 to 6.9	May cause a lot of damage in very populated areas
7.0 to 7.9	Major earthquake, serious damage
8.0 or greater	Great earthquake, can destroy communities near the epicentre

Earthquakes can trigger secondary events such as landslides, tsunamis and fires caused by downed power lines and ruptured gas mains.

STEP THREE - PACK SUPPLIES


