





FIVE STEPS TO GET READY FOR A LANDSLIDE

STEP ONE -UNDERSTAND YOUR RISK

What is a landslide?

LANDSLIDES can be sudden and fast moving, shifting millions of tonnes of earth, mud and rock. They can be caused by a major event such as an earthquake, but in Queensland and the Rockhampton Region landslides are generally caused by heavy rain.



Landslide damage and impact

The impact of a landslide can be extensive, including destruction of infrastructure, damage to land, loss of natural resources, and, in extreme circumstances, loss of life. Landslide material can also block rivers and increase the risk of floods.

Within our Region, residents with property built on or near a slope are most likely to be impacted by a landslide.

Am I in a landslide prone area?

Log on to Council's Emergency Dashboard to access steep land mapping for the Rockhampton Region which provides an indication of where landslides are most likely to occur. STEP TWO - MAKE A PLAN

STEP THREE - PACK SUPPLIES

Pack your Emergency Kit with essential supplies in the case you are unable to leave your home for an extended period of time, and your Evacuation Kit if it becomes unsafe to remain and you need to leave your home. STEP FOUR - PREPARE YOUR HOME
