





FIVE STEPS TO GET READY FOR A STORM

STEP ONE -UNDERSTAND YOUR RISK

What is a storm?

STORMS can comprise of heavy rainfall and flash flooding, damaging winds, lightning strikes and hail.


Storms can last many hours and travel long distances, potentially causing damage to homes and vehicles, and causing loss of power, isolation and flash flooding.



Severe storms or thunderstorms, as classified by the Bureau of Meteorology (BoM), are storms that are likely to produce:

- Large hail measuring more than 2cm in diameter;
- Wind speeds of more than 90 km an hour; and
- Heavy rainfall conducive to flash flooding.

The Bureau of Meteorology issues severe thunderstorm warnings for thunderstorms that are expected to produce any the above severe phenomena. For more information go to bom.gov.au.



Severe Thunderstorm Warnings

Severe Thunderstorm Warnings contain the following information:

- · Standard Emergency Warning Signal (SEWS) sounded only for the most serious events
- · Phenomena expected in the warning area, e.g. large hail, damaging winds, flash flooding
- Immediate threat area (graphical detailed warning)
- Storm location and movement (graphical detailed warning)
- Warning issue time
- Description of the threat
- Action statements
- Advice of next issue time

STEP TWO - MAKE A PLAN

STEP THREE - PACK SUPPLIES

Pack your Emergency Kit with essential supplies in the case you are unable to leave your home for an extended period of time, and your Evacuation Kit if it becomes unsafe to remain and you need to leave your home. STEP FOUR - PREPARE YOUR HOME
