





VECTOR MANAGEMENT

The following is a summary of the activities of the Vector Management Unit for the month of March 2014.

Surveillance of Fitzroy River: After receiving approximately 350mm of rain over several days a non-scheduled surveillance was arranged to be undertaken on Thursday 27 march. Due to the extent of the inclement weather Officers were unable to access the breeding sites. Given the recent history of treatments undertaken and the presence of adult mosquitoes on the breeding sites on these occasions, it was determined that a treatment would be necessary as the emergence of mosquito larva from the rain received would be above the threshold level. Eight sites were treated, a total of 140 hectares. On Saturday 29 March the weather had improved sufficiently to allow access to breeding sites and post surveillance was undertaken. Post-treatment sampling indicated a 99.5 per centum larva mortality rate.

Surveillance of Urban Saltmarsh: Due to receiving approximately 350mm of rain over several days the scheduled surveillance was unable to be undertaken as access to the sites was restricted. Mosquito breeding would have been minimised as the main areas of these sites are controlled by the methoprene briquettes, which in this form produce a residual for several months.

Surveillance of Freshwater Areas: Surveillance of fourteen freshwater sites was undertaken. Above-threshold mosquito breeding was found in one site, which was treated. Post-treatment sampling indicated a 99 per centum larva mortality rate.

Property Inspections: Property inspections for dengue management were undertaken on six properties. The inspections found none of the properties breeding *Aedes aegypti*, however two properties were found to be breeding other species of mosquitoes. In each case the source of breeding was removed or treated to achieve control.





Parking Infringements Comparison Year to Date March 2014






Animal Infringements Comparison Year to Date March 2014






Local Law Infringements Comparison Year to Date March 2014
