SUMMARY

The Rockhampton Airport Masterplan is a 20 year pathway for the growth and development of the Rockhampton Airport and is the culmination of nearly 2 years of development and refinement.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT:

- 1. Council adopt the Rockhampton Airport Masterplan 2017 2037, Gateway to Northern Australia and associated promotional document; and
- 2. Council commence the planning for the delivery of the Masterplan on a staged basis instigating the Rockhampton Airport Gateway Project.

BACKGROUND

Council appointed Leading Edge Aviation Planning Professionals (LEAPP) to jointly develop and deliver the Rockhampton Airport Masterplan. This required the consolidation of previous airport development documents to create a single document.

DISCUSSION

The Masterplan delivers a roadmap for development of the entire site over the next 20 years; positively affecting our Defence, Tourism, Agricultural and Resources sectors. While also diversifying our economy to enhance our emerging Aviation, Freight, Transport and Logistics specific industries, creating jobs and prosperity for the region and turning the airport into an aviation hub.

Rockhampton Regional Council's commitment to the growth and development of the Rockhampton Airport through the proposed Rockhampton Airport Gateway Project has been previously demonstrated via the continual investment and vision to forward plan for the Airport's future. The Rockhampton Airport Gateway Project will deliver structured business cases and lay the foundations to focus on key development priorities for the Airport over the next 20 years.

The Rockhampton Airport Masterplan, while set for a 20 year growth and development cycle, will need to be continually reviewed and developed throughout its life to ensure it is adapting to the future needs of the community and keeping pace with technology.

The Masterplan introduces the airport, its history as well as the recommended future development and covers the following key subject areas:

- Infrastructure
- Future Development
- Future Development Requirements

- Site Development Concepts
- Masterplan
- Obstacle Limitation Surfaces
- Recent Activities
- Appendices that cover future development options and noise exposure forecasts

The Masterplan and associated delivery focus being the Rockhampton Airport Gateway Project will not only deliver catalytic growth benefits for the entire region, underpinning the future of our regional economy, but also ensure that our Tourism, Defence, Resources and Agricultural sectors have access to new and emerging markets, creating a true hub airport.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that Council adopt the Masterplan and associated promotional document and commence the planning for the delivery of the masterplan on a staged basis via the Rockhampton Airport Gateway Project



ROCKHAMPTON AIRPORT MASTERPLAN, TECHNICAL CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY DOCUMENT

The Rockhampton Airport is a highly diversified Regional Airport that plays an important role in Central Queensland as a Gateway Airport to the Region and Northern Australia. The Airport's 2628m high strength (ACN72/C/1400mpa) main runway is the 3rd longest in Queensland and 5th longest in Regional Australia. The runway width is 60m with grooving throughout the runway surface to 45m and state of the art LED runway ground lighting system.

Airside infrastructure, taxiway and aprons support all categories of Aircraft and as result Rockhampton Airport is an alternate for the A380 aircraft type, the only airport capable of receiving this aircraft type on the Queensland Coast between Cairns and Brisbane. Currently the Airport is serviced by 3 Airlines as a mainline regional Airport for Queensland with direct services to Townsville / Mackay / Brisbane / Gold Coast and indirect services to Cairns

In addition to the current Regular Passenger Transport (RPT) services, the airport functions to support the Australian Defence Force, Singapore Armed Forces, United States Military and Australia's regional Allies during training exercises. General Aviation Activity is also a key feature of the Airport

Passenger numbers at the Rockhampton Airport are steady and have not been subject to the fluctuations recently experienced at Regional Airports, over the past 10 years passenger numbers have averaged 600 000 per annum. The Passenger Terminal was redeveloped in 2008 and has the ability to process 1.6M passengers per annum.

There is no curfew at the Airport.

Air Services Australia provides Aviation Fire Fighting and Rescue Services as well as State of the Art Air Traffic Control Tower facilities that were redeveloped in 2012

While the Rockhampton Airport supports a high level of Military Activity the Airport is first and foremost a civilian Airport and the Royal Australian Air Force or the Air Force of any nation utilising the Rockhampton Airport does not have priority over civilian services

Caltex and Shell operate both tanker and hydrant fuel facilities on the main apron

The Airport is fully Civil Aviation Safety Authority and Office of Transport Security compliant with all recent audit information available upon request.



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


