8.1 FLOOD RISK PROFILE REPORT: 261 HOOK STREET, BERSERKER

SUMMARY

A flood risk profile is presented for the property at 261 Hook Street, Berserker to assist Council's future decision-making regarding this property.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT the flood risk profile report for 261 Hook Street, Berserker be received.

COMMENTARY

On 10 February 2009, Council resolved to purchase the property located at 261 Hook Street, Berserker, for drainage purposes. The single story brick and tile house is characterised by slab on ground, with a finished floor level of 19.2m AHD. Ground elevation at the property ranges from 18.8m AHD to 19.25 m AHD. The property falls within the Frenchmans Creek catchment area but is not identified as being at risk of either creek or riverine flooding. The property does, however, experience flooding from overland flow - including above floor flooding in the 1%AEP and more frequent (lower magnitude) events, due to having an overland flowpath that runs through the property and the dwelling footprint

Existing Flood Risk for 261 Hook Street, Berserker

The catchment for Hook Street is long and narrow, and runs to the east of Berserker Street from the North Rockhampton High School, before discharging into McLeod Park. An updated flood study has recently been completed for the area, and officers have assessed the flood risk for the property at 261 Hook Street, Berserker in light of the updated flood information for the catchment. From this process, the following flood risk details have been ascertained:

- The property contains an overland flowpath which experiences some inundation during flood events from the 1EY and up.
- Velocities within the overland flowpath range from less than 0.25m/s in the 39%AEP to ~1.5m/s in the 1%AEP flood event
- Peak flood depths within the overland flowpath range from less than 0.3m to 0.5m in the 1% AEP flood event
- Model results indicate that the property experiences inundation above floor in the minor flood events (from the 1EY and up)
- In terms of flood hazard, the overland flowpath at 261 Hook Street, Berserker is shown to exhibit a 'H2' level of hazard in the 1% AEP event, which denotes a proposed Planning Area 2 designation for this property. As such, any future development will need to mitigate against this flood hazard by addressing the proposed planning scheme provisions for Planning Area 2, and adopting a 500mm freeboard above the Defined flood level for all finished floor levels.

Additional analysis:

Officers have undertaken further analysis using surveyed levels for the property to confirm a 1%AEP flood level of 19.6m AHD at the front door (which has a surveyed level of 19.218m AHD). As such, this property experiences over floor flooding approximately 0.4m above the floor level during a 1%AEP local flood event.

Modelling results also indicate that the property experiences inundation above floor in the minor flood events (from the 1EY and up). Flood levels extracted for the 63% AEP, 39%AEP, and 18% AEP relative to the front door survey level show depths of inundation above floor at 0.13m, 0.19m, and 0.24m respectively for these events. Appendices A and B of the 'Summary of Attachments Companion document' to this report provide extracts of mapping and other data to support the above conclusions.

BACKGROUND

Council has recently improved upon its flood information and risk profiling of the Frenchmans and Thozets Creek catchment areas through the completion of an updated flood study for these catchments in 2017. The study has improved the accuracy of the identification of flood hazards, and flood mapping now includes the identification of areas which may be subject to medium, high, and extreme hazard due to overland flow which has the potential to cause risk to life, and property damage.

An additional component of the Frenchmans and Thozets Creek Flood Study involved the preliminary identification of flood management options for high risk areas which may benefit from structural flood mitigation investment to minimise flood damages and risk within the catchment. For 261 Hook Street, Berserker - the proposed Simpson Street and High Street Drainage Scheme has been identified to address high risk stormwater and flooding concerns in the sub-catchment area containing this property.

Preliminary assessment of this scheme undertaken in the context of addressing the over floor flooding issues for 261 Hook Street indicates a slight reduction of up to 75mm in the 1%AEP flood levels for inundation above floor, with the property still likely to experience above floor flooding by up to 0.3m (at the door) in the 1%AEP mitigated scenario. The scheme offers negligible reductions for the lower order flood events. As such, the proposed Simpson & High Street Drainage Scheme is not considered to be adaptable for the purposes of managing or improving flooding impacts at 261 Hook Street, Berserker.

PREVIOUS DECISIONS

In February 2009, Council resolved to purchase the property at 261 Hook Street, Berserker, for drainage purposes (Resolution Item 8.1.1 of the Council Meeting held 10th February 2009). The property was purchased by Council on the 10th of March 2009.

In July 2009, Council resolved to lease the property to the Salvation Army, in accordance with section 236 (1)(b)(ii) and section 236 (1)(c)(iii) of the *Local Government Regulation 2012*. This lease has recently ended.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The flood risk designation and propensity for over floor flooding for the property at 261 Hook Street, Berserker are not likely to be relieved by the proposed Simpson Street and High Street Drainage Scheme in the foreseeable future. If Council were to complement the proposed scheme with an additional mitigation scheme, there may be some recourse in the over-floor flooding aspect, however this cannot be guaranteed. To this end, the residual risk of over floor flooding still remains for this property, along with its hazard (H2) and proposed Planning Area 2 designation.

CONCLUSION

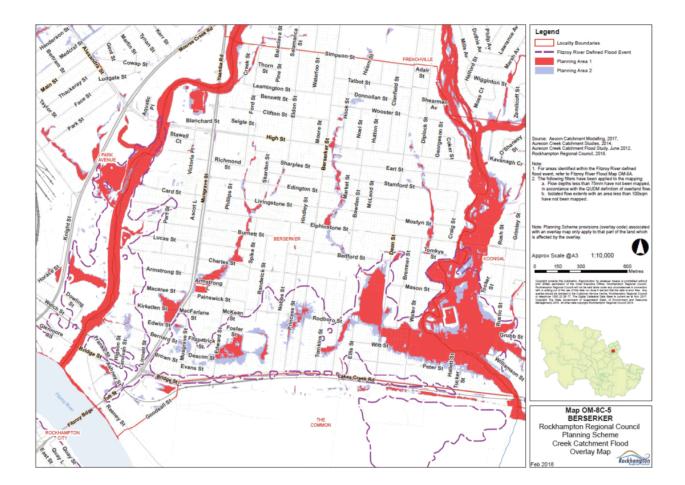

Figure 2: Overview Map of Creek Catchment Flood Overlay Map OM-8C-5 Berserker

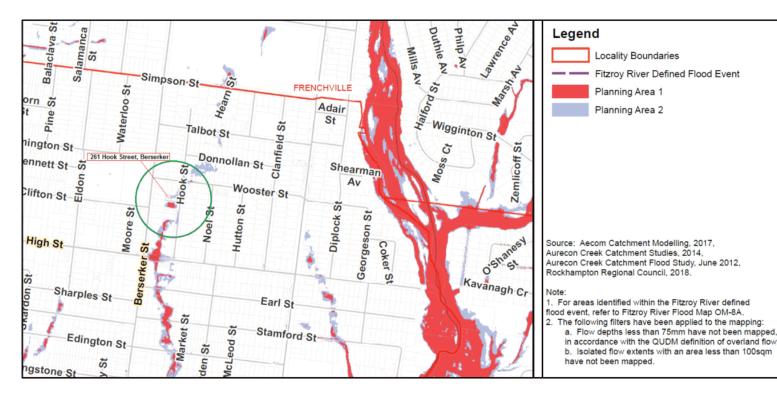
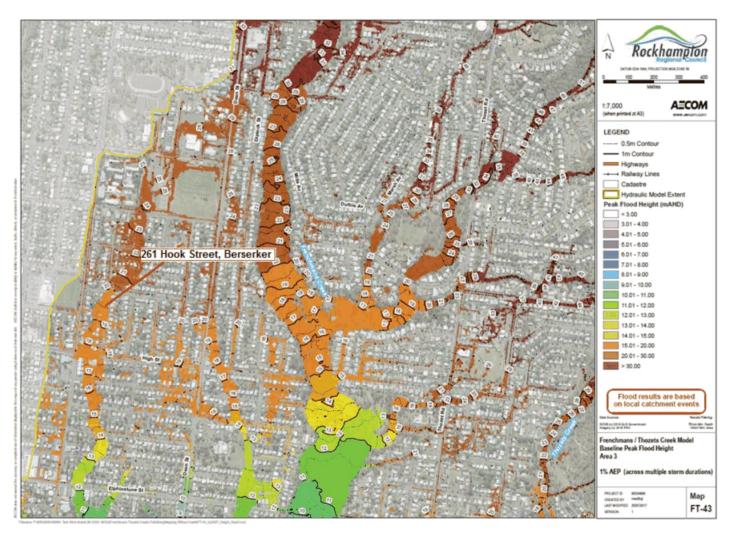


Figure 3: Extract from OM-8C-5 Berserker: The property at 261 Hook Street, Berserker will trigger Planning Area 2 provisions, as it is shown to exhibit a 'H2' Hazard under the ARR 2016 Flood Hazard Classifications which have been adopted as part of the Planning Scheme Major Amendment.

8.2 POISON CREEK ROAD IMMUNITY

SUMMARY

A subsequent investigation has been conducted into the works required to improve the flood immunity of the existing low level floodways on Poison Creek Road and the immunity of the wider Razorback Road route to Mount Morgan.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Poison Creek Road Immunity Report be 'received'.

COMMENTARY

The Planning and Regulatory committee requested an investigation into providing a higher level of flood immunity to residents in Mount Morgan, through the upgrade of the floodways on Poison Creek Road. A subsequent request was made to consider the flood immunity of the wider Razorback Road route to Mount Morgan to provide context to the benefit provided by the culverts on Poison Creek Road.

Officers performed a preliminary assessment of the route from the Burnett Highway to Mount Morgan along the Razorback Road. It identified that there are 14 major cross drainage locations on the Razorback Road route to Mount Morgan (Attachment 1). Of these 14, 4 are flood ways (Cross Drainage 1 – 4 on Poison Creek Road and Razorback Road). The remaining 10 cross drainage structure are culverts. Review of the Mount Morgan Local Catchment flood model has indicated that the remaining 10 cross drainage culverts do not have 1%AEP capacity and result in water over the road in a 1%AEP event. At many of these culverts, flood water overtops the road in an 18%AEP (5year ARI) event. This is due to a combination of the culvert size and the velocity of the floodwater in this mountainous area. Given the low immunity of the Razorback Road route to Mount Morgan, it is not recommended to upgrade cross drainage 1 and 2 at this current time.

Officers have corresponded with the Department of Transport and Main Roads (DTMR) regarding the flood immunity of the Mount Morgan Range. Previous issues with the isolation of Mount Morgan residents and detour to the Razorback Road has been due to the substantial closure of the Mount Morgan Range after the 2013 rain event. DTMR have not conducted any flood studies in this area and are currently not able to provide an assessment of the flood immunity of the Burnett Highway at Mount Morgan. High level review of the contours and road alignment indicates that the immunity of the Mount Morgan Range may be greater than that of the Razorback Road.

BACKGROUND

Poison Creek Road provides a connection between the Burnett Highway and the Razorback Road, in particular for heavy vehicles that utilise the link to bypass the Mount Morgan Range crossing when travelling between Mount Morgan and Rockhampton / Gracemere. The road has an AADT of 1,081 (2016) including 7.5% heavy vehicles, and is currently identified as an approved B-Double route under TMR's Multi Combination Vehicle mapping.

The road currently utilises two low level concrete floodways to cross the minor waterways at each end of the link. These low level crossings become inundated in small rain events (39% AEP), causing the temporary closure of Poison Creek Road for vehicles. As Poison Creek is one of the major collector roads for the community of Mount Morgan, an investigation into improvements to the flood immunity was undertaken.

PREVIOUS DECISIONS

On 24 July 2018, The Infrastructure Committee resolved:

THAT a further report be prepared identifying the number of flood events at which this road would have provided access, when no other road would have provided access.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

Currently there is no budget allocation for these works

CONCLUSION

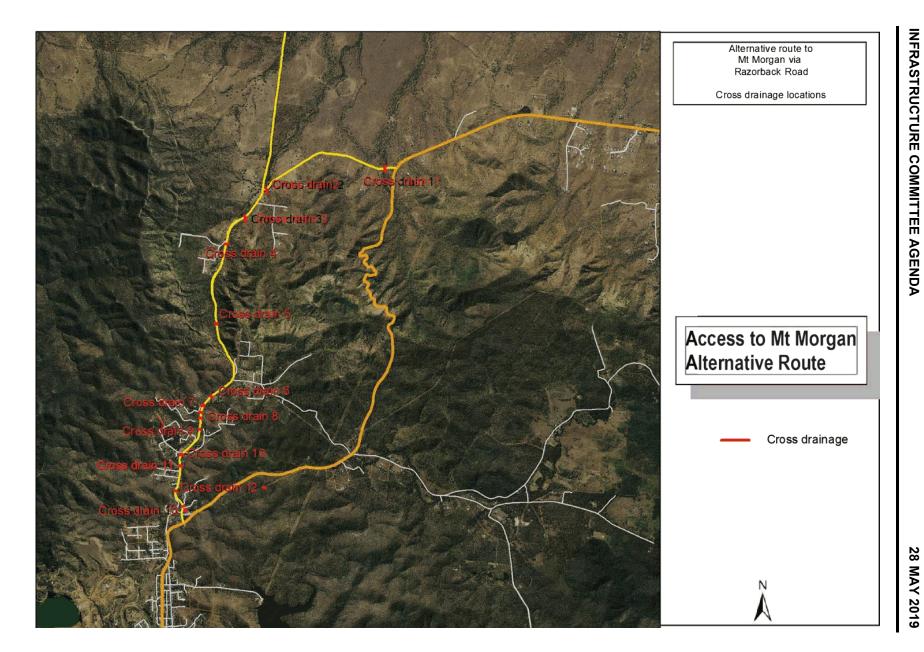

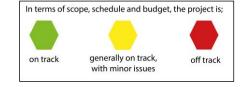

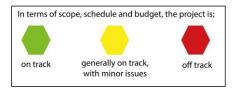

MONTHLY OPERATIONS REPORT

Infrastructure Planning PERIOD ENDED April 2019



1. Highlights

<u>Civil Design</u>

During April 2019 planning to complete the 2019/2020 Capital Budget Design works has been programmed, as well as scheduling investigation of minor projects (which are typically unfunded projects), with all work from the 2018/2019 Capital budget completed or at final approval stage.

The majority of this work will be completed using internal design resources, with only two projects being outsourced to consultants, those being:

- Harriette Street Drainage (design required ASAP to allow construction during Wackford Street drainage upgrade).
- Forest Park (Stage 1) Open Drain.

The design of fishing platforms in the Rockhampton City reach of the Fitzroy River (3 x estuarine and 1 x freshwater) and at the Mount Morgan Number 7 dam is progressing well, with all designs and environmental approvals expected to be completed by June 2019 for construction in year 2019/2020.

The design of Alexandra Street Road Reconstruction (Stages 2 & 3) is progressing well, with the intention to continue construction of these stages immediately following the completion of Stage 1.

Strategic Infrastructure

Officers have appointed Water Modelling Solutions to complete modelling work and drainage design works in Gracemere for the upcoming LGIP review. Officers have also gone out to tender for some refinement of several local catchment hazard mapping and flood overlay mapping. These updates are anticipated to be completed by EOFY.

Sewer network modelling continues to enable review of the future water and sewer infrastructure schemes as part of an upcoming LGIP review. This work considers the currently proposed schemes and whether they are still necessary to service future development. The focus at the moment has been on the Gracemere Water and Sewer Schemes and modifying their timeframes to reflect the changes in development patterns in Gracemere.

Officers have met with DTMR to discuss the Inner Rockhampton Mesoscopic Model base year calibration. It was generally agreed that the model has calibrated well and now the focus is on delivering the future year scenarios in the coming weeks. This model will inform both the Council LGIP projects as well as future DTMR projects. Officers have begun compiling applications for this year's round of Blackspot funding. Unsuccessful projects from the previous year will be resubmitted and some additional projects will be added to the application list based on crash data or road safety audits. Officers are also continuing the preliminary design of Transport projects identified in the LGIP to update the LGIP costings and inform future budgets.

Assets and GIS

Bridge Condition Assessments

Officers continue to perform routine condition assessments and defect monitoring activities as planned.

All on-site inspections and testing associated with the Level 3 bridge investigations have been completed. A final report from ARRB is expected in June 2019.

Road Condition Assessments

Officers are currently reviewing the methodology that is used to determine the condition and remaining useful life of our unsealed road pavements. This technical review will include discussions with Civil Operations on the methodology they use to develop their gravel re-sheet programs. On completion, this review will inform the scope of works for 2019/20 road condition assessments.

Footpath Inspections

The 2019 footpath inspection program has commenced. This year the entire footpath network (219km) is scheduled for inspection. To date approximately 57km (26%) of the footpath network has been inspected.

Asset Data Reviews

Work continues on the review of Council's asset data in both GIS and Conquest.

- The Conquest review of all road segments is now on hold as end of year capitalisations take precedence
- The GIS and Conquest review of all buildings has been completed
- The GIS and Conquest review of all traffic signals has been completed

ESRI and GeoCortex Upgrades

Work continues on the ESRI and GeoCortex upgrades. Testing of the new external test sites has been completed and all feedback has been actioned. ESRI have completed a health check on the external test servers. Officers are now waiting on a report from ESRI with their recommendations.

Asset Revaluations

Officers continue to work with Finance on the water and sewer revaluations. These revaluations are on track to be completed by 31 May 2019, which is in accordance with the External Audit Plan.

The land revaluation was loaded into Conquest on 18 April 2019. As per the External Audit Plan this was due for completion by 30 April 2019

Key Meetings and Workshops

- Central Highlands Regional Council Recovery Workshop, to gain an understanding of the Recovery impacts across the District (similar and shared themes) and commence the development of a regional strategy for the management of the Cat C CDO program.
- Aerodrome Emergency Committee Meeting Planning for 2019 AEP Exercise

Key Activities

- Council's LDMG Executive and DMO were provided the opportunity to review the first draft of the Confidential 2018 Queensland Bushfires Review. Feedback was provided to IGEM to further highlight Council's experience of the November events.
- The review of the Bushfire Mitigation strategy and MOU continues
- Council's Recovery and Resilience Working Group met on 12 April. It reflected on the current recovery status and discussed options and priorities for the Cat C Flexible Funding grants.

2. Innovations, Improvements and Variations

Civil Design

Civil Design Unit has recently upgraded their lighting design software. The previous version was a DOS based system which required significant manual input and was difficult to produce multiple design options. The updated version integrates directly with the drafting software which makes it seamless and expedient to produce multiple design options to compare and adopt the most suitable for the particular site. This has led to significant time savings in producing lighting designs, as well as removed the requirement for manual inputs which has increased accuracy.

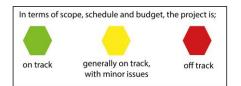

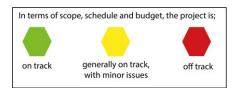
