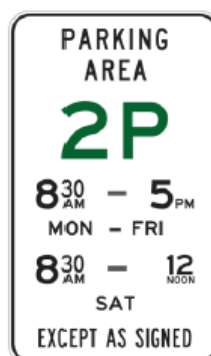
Area Parking Control



To create a visually pleasing area as well as allow for uniform parking where a large number of parks require parking restrictions, Council can create a designated Parking Area. Locations requiring this type of control are designated by the Council under the Local Laws to meet the needs of the community and business in the area. Area parking control signs operate using entry and exit signs to define a boundary of a controlled area.

On-street area parking control has been in place within the CBD for almost 20 years. In late 2017, the area parking control was extended to include Quay Street between William Street and Fitzroy Street. This parking area is regulated to 2 hours maximum time allowed, unless signed otherwise.

Clear regulatory parking area signs are displayed at all entrances and exits to the zone. These signs indicate the relevant parking time restriction and the hours the restrictions apply. The restrictions apply to all bays in the area, unless signed otherwise (e.g. signed loading zones, persons with disability bays, or other time restriction).



Parking is enforced by police and Council Local Laws officers in accordance with Rockhampton Regional Council Local Law No 5 (Parking) 2011 and the Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Road Rules) Regulation 2009 (TORUM). Unlawful parking should be reported to the Queensland Police Service (QPS) through their Policelink line on 131 444, or to Council's Local Laws officers through the Customer Service Centre on 1300 22 55 77.
