


### CRAIGNAUGHT ROAD LOCATION PLAN









## Mildura Rise Estate

### Do we want it?

Positives	Negatives	
Benefits to the Rockhampton community, more jobs created, more people accessing local businesses, bigger local workforce pool etc but living outside of the LGA	Utilizing capacity of Council's existing network that maybe used for growth within RRC in the future.	
The northern corridor is Rockhampton's logical growth corridor into the future with the existing constraints to the south and west.	No advantage gained from General Rates revenue that would flow to LSC and potentially displaces demand (and resulting revenue) within the RRC boundary, noting that General Rates income cross subsidise development to some extent. (i.e., only collect circa 50% of the cost of trunk infrastructure via infrastructure charges.)	
May help with any future boundary relocation discussions.		
Additional revenue and infrastructure charges payable to ensure any direct costs and bring forward costs (capex) are appropriately considered along with opex costs.		
Beneficial use of existing spare sewerage network capacity, including the augmented NRSTP, providing a return on already sunk/committed investments.		
Helps to address Qld's Housing Shortage		

### How to deal with it

- Negotiate an agreement similar to the Bulk Water Supply agreement with LSC
- Terms would need to be agreed :
  - Infrastructure charges payable
  - Bring forward costs
  - Point of connection
  - Operation and maintenance responsibilities
  - Sewer Rates
