Additional Information

Council may consider withdrawal of an infringement notice if you can demonstrate any of the following occurred at the time of the offence:

- Your vehicle broke down and you were unable to move it to a legal position;
- You were involved in a medical emergency;
- You were issued the infringement notice in error;
- You were issued an infringement notice as the registered owner of the vehicle that, at the time of the offence, the vehicle had been sold or stolen, or was under the permitted control of another person;
- You were issued the infringement notice as the registered owner of land and you were not at the time of the offence the registered owner of the land; or
- Regulatory signs had been removed or damaged.

Infringement notices will not be withdrawn for a number of reasons including:

- Being unaware of the law or not seeing a sign;
- Disagreeing with the law; or
- You may feel the offence for which the infringement notice has been issued is trivial or did not cause a problem to anyone.
