The application is for 'waive down', that is, the operator must be waived down in order to make a sale. Products must be ready for sale or available in a short period. The operator must remain stopped only for the duration of the sale and must not wait for customers. Mobile roadside vending cannot by undertaken in the Rockhampton CBD exclusion zone being bound by Derby, Archer and Denison Streets and the Fitzroy River.

Roadside Vending

Council has a role in regulating roadside vending to ensure these activities are carried out in a safe manner for customers, pedestrians and traffic, while preventing nuisances to the surrounding environment.

While no applications are required for the remainder of the 2020/2021 financial year, retailers and hospitality outlets will be required to make formal application for Commercial Use of Local Government Controlled Area and Roads if they wish to continue commercial use of the footpath from 1 July 2021.

What is Roadside Vending?

There are two types of roadside vending:

Mobile Roadside Vending – where an operator solicits or carries on the supply of goods or services (including food or drink) for profit in circumstances where the operator travels from place to place and the operator supplies the goods or services to a customer in response to the customer waiving down the operator.

Example: a mobile ice-cream van using amplified music to attract customers while driving.

Stationary Roadside Vending – where an operator solicits or carries on the supply of goods or services (including food or drink) for profit in circumstances where the activity is carried on from a specified place or a number of specified places. This does not include footpath dining.

Example: a roadside stall selling fruit or vegetables, a pie/ coffee van selling food and drink.



Trading on Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads

Roadside vendors wanting to trade on Local Government controlled areas and/or roads require approval in accordance with Subordinate Local Law No. 1.2 (Commercial Use of Local Government Controlled Areas and Roads) 2011. Further approval may be required by Council's Parks unit where vending is intended to take place from a Council owned park or reserve.

Food vending is not permitted in the Central Business District (CBD). This exclusion zone is bounded by Derby, Archer and Denison Streets and the Fitzroy

Trading on Private Land

Roadside vending approval is not required when trading on private land, however you should check with Council's Development Assessment unit to see if planning approval is required.

Trading on a Main Road

Roadside vending approval is not required from Council when trading on a main (State Governmentcontrolled) road; however you should check with Department of Transport and Main Roads to see if an approval is required.







General Requirements

Roadside vendors should take the following conditions/ requirements into consideration prior to deciding the location of their activity and making an application with Council:

- Take measures to protect the safety of persons who may be involved in, or affected by, the activity;
- Take out and maintain insurance for a minimum of \$20 million for Council controlled roads indemnifying Rockhampton Regional Council against any or all claims of damages resulting from the activity;
- Allow for the operation of the activity, including any vehicle or premises used in the operation of the activity, to be inspected by an authorised person;
- The activity of this type must not be operated within 150m radius of a fixed premise which sells or offers for sale the same or similar goods or services, or the site of another prescribed activity which the same or similar goods or services are sold or offered for sale;
- The activity must not:
 - a. cause a nuisance;
 - b. create a traffic nuisance;
 - c. increase an existing traffic nuisance;
 - d. detrimentally affect the efficiency of the road network;
 - e. detrimentally affect the amenity of the neighbourhood;
 - f. create a road safety risk.
- The activity must not amplify, or cause to be made, any noise identifying or otherwise drawing attention to the vehicle, except in accordance with standards laid down under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*;
- Customers must only be served from the non-traffic or kerbside side of the vehicle;
- Trading is not to be located where customers would be required to park in a kerbside lane or where parking/standing restrictions apply.

Are you Selling Food?

You may also require a Food Business Licence. Check with Council's Environment and Public Health unit to see if a food licence is required.



How to Apply for an Approval

To apply for a roadside vending approval, you will need to submit a completed Commercial Use of Roads Application Form – Mobile Roadside Vending or a Commercial Use of Roads Application Form – Stationary Roadside Vending with supporting documentation and pay the relevant application fee. Supporting information includes:

- A site plan (1:100 refer individual application form for specific requirements);
- Certificate of Cover for Public Liability Insurance with a minimum of \$20 million dollars and noting Rockhampton Regional Council as an interested party;
- Copy of current registration certificates for each vehicle proposed to be used in the operation of the activity;
- Coloured photographs of the proposed vehicle/s.

The application process can take up to 30 days from date of submission to the final approval, should there be no further information required. If further information is required, this will extend the application process by at least seven to 14 days. Contact Council for an application form.
